A NOTE from PASTOR JOHN

Sharing Highs and Lows

"...and be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you." – Ephesians 4:32

Over fifty times in the New Testament letters, Christians are given instruction and encouragement about living with 'one another' in faith. I think those reminders are as crucial today as they ever were. Our lives have been shaken by a number of untimely deaths of young people in our community in the last weeks and months. We struggle to understand, we long for answers, and we grieve. Then we ask ourselves what we can do.

There are no simple answers, but I do believe that each day we need to listen, talk, pray, and love. Each week via email and the back of bulletin there is this first simple instruction – "Share you highs and lows." Then follow some suggestions for more reflection. But that first step remains vital. We need to take the time, make the time, to share. We need to gather as family at home, and family at church, and be present to one another.

We need to be kind and tender-hearted in a world that is often too hurried, too stressed, too critical of others, and often leaves people isolated and feeling hopeless. We need to be a living sign of Jesus' love and compassion for our own children, and for the young people in our neighborhoods, businesses, and community.

Local pastors, school personnel and counselors have been meeting to share resources and ideas to help individuals and families. I'd like to share a few simple tips from a pamphlet: "Helping Children Cope After a Traumatic Event"

- Make your child feel safe – hug them, reassure them
- Act Calm – children look to adults for reassurance
- Maintain routines as much as possible
- Share information about what has happened - too often the rumors outrace the truth and can make more anxiety
- Pick good times to talk
- Understand that children cope in different ways



- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 blunt scissors
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens
- 1 box of crayons, 16 or 24 count
- 1 2 ½" eraser
- Shipping money

- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.




