A Note from PASTOR JOHN

Each day a new beginning

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." Acts 2:1-4

We are fast approaching the 3rd great festival of the Christian year, Pentecost, and the coming of the Holy Spirit. It is perhaps a very good time to think about what happened that first Pentecost. A small band of disciples, unsure of what the future held, not sure that they had the tools to address the world around them. But God's very Spirit filled them, not just once, but day after day and granted them the gifts to share in the ministry of the kingdom of God. From that first day, the world would never be the same. That same Spirit is among us whenever we gather, and will continue to grant the gifts we need to address the world around us.

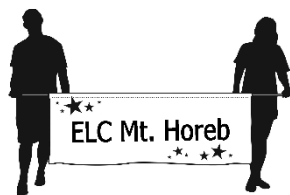

Faith & the Mustard Seed

He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches."

–Matthew 13:31-32 (NIV)

The "Parable of the Mustard Seed" above is one of my favorite parables because in just these short two sentences there is so much hope. As the seasons finally begin to change it also seems fitting as I have been seeing the leaves and flowers begin to show their colors again. The mustard seed, in fact all seeds, are extremely small and yet yield remarkable and often HUGE results in compared to the small beginnings. This is in the forefront of my mind as ELC begins to have conversations about outreach, the future, and the exciting ways this congregation may have a lasting impact on the community both inside and outside the church walls. As those conversations began at the most recent Church Council meeting and will continue; I offer this parable as a reminder that no matter what – no matter how small or no matter the times when we may feel like our faith "isn't big enough" that God is there with us through it all. The times when we have the BIG ideas, and even the really small ones; when we have BIG faith and the times, especially, when our faith can barely be seen. A little faith goes a long way; a mustard seed's-worth has miraculous potential.

GENERAL FUND YTD General Fund income (17 weekends) is 21% more than prior year (17 weekends) and 12% more than budget. YTD expenses (excluding intern compensation, covered by a transfer from the Designated Fund) are 4% less than prior year, primarily due to support staff hours and the net effect of several non-salary variances, most notably reduced maintenance expenses; YTD expenses are 3% more than budget, primarily due to snow removal, building maintenance, insurance (timing), and technology, partially offset by savings in outreach & support staff.

Uniting to Assist Our Neighbors After Disaster

Last summer's floods in the region reminded us the impact an organized network of volunteer helpers can make.

Lutherans United Assisting After Disaster (LUAD) leaped into action after requests from St. Martin's Lutheran in Cross Plains and New Heights Lutheran in Black Earth after flooding events in mid-August. Another call came from St. John's Lutheran Church in Reedsburg to assist people in the Baraboo River valley.

Within LUAD, there is a saying: "We're family helping family." Volunteers work with local agencies to fill gaps where residents can't get assistance with needed services during stressful times. LUAD president Todd Long reports that volunteers regularly help people navigate the rocky claims process, and in one instance loaded a borrowed generator and a pump into a truck to bail out areas most affected by the river's crest.

In June, we'll collect donations through the Benevolence Program to provide LUAD the resources its volunteers need to help others in our region. Thanks for supporting LUAD and other charitable efforts throughout the year. Our dollars are making a difference in our community and beyond.

in. Eligible donors must be at least 17 years old, or 16 years old with a signed Red Cross parental/guardian consent form where state permits, must weigh at least 110 pounds and be in general good health.

SUMMER WORSHIP CHANGES Beginning the first weekend in June we'll be trying some new things in our 10:00am worship.

- We will meet in fellowship hall each week, June 2 through Labor Day weekend.
- We'll still have music with the Praise Team.
- All those who worship will be invited to sit around tables, (you can even bring your coffee cup).
- We'll share in prayer, scripture, and a message, but we'll also set aside time to discuss some questions with those who join you for worship. (You don't have to talk if you don't want to).
- Our hope is that we explore the Bible story together and get better acquainted with each other.
- We'll also have air conditioning available when the weather gets hot.

Saturday evening worship will also move to Fellowship Hall for the summer months.

WOMEN OF ELC: WHERE DO I FIT IN? As we joined the congregation, we each promised our time, talents, and treasure to the work of this "Family of Faith". There are many opportunities to participate through music, education, and service. Especially for women are the Bible study and Sewing Circles and the Social Committees.

"Circle" is the name given to the groups we choose to join for fellowship, growth, and mission work. These groups focus on special projects for Lutheran World Relief, Bible study, and personal relationships.

"Social Committee" is the name given to each working group. Women are assigned to these groups when they join the congregation. These groups take turns serving our Family of Faith much like many of us take turns serving at home. Each committee is on call one month of the year to work at any funeral lunches that occur. All family members are encouraged to pitch in and help when possible. Sometimes, a Social Committee is called for special

service, such as a potluck, brunch, or anniversary. At these times, members may be asked to work a shift, bring food, or contribute financially to help with the costs of the event. A chairperson will contact committee members when their service is needed, usually once every 2 years.
