## A Message from PASTOR JOHN

#### **Welcoming the Stranger**

God gave the following instruction to the people of Israel: "The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. I am the LORD your God." Leviticus 19:34 (NIV)

And when pressed about the question "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus responded with the Parable of the Good Samaritan, which concludes: "Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" <sup>37</sup> The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." **Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."** Luke 10:36-37

From the beginning to the end the Bible seems clear about our response to those in need, regardless of every human distinction, we are called to love. In that spirit, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly passed a motion to declare us a 'Sanctuary Church Body'. I've had some people wonder what this means. Here's a couple of those answers.

What does becoming a sanctuary denomination mean for the ELCA? In its simplest form, becoming a sanctuary denomination means that the ELCA is publicly declaring that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith. The Churchwide Assembly declared that when we preach on Sunday that Jesus told us to welcome, we will use our hands and voices on Monday to make sure it happens.

- Being a sanctuary denomination does not call for any person, congregation or synod to engage in any illegal actions.
- We have a broken system regarding immigration, refugees and asylum- seekers.
- Being a sanctuary denomination is about loving our neighbors.

While we may have different ideas about how to fix this broken system and may have different ways of loving our neighbors, our call to love our neighbor is central to our faith. For more information visit: https://www.elca.org/sanctuarychurch

BOOK READ <u>Searching for Sunday</u> by Rachel Held Evans

Like millions of her millennial peers, Rachel Held Evans didn't want to go to church anymore. The hypocrisy, the politics, the gargantuan building budgets, the scandals--church culture seemed so far removed from Jesus. Yet, despite her cynicism and misgivings, something kept

drawing her back to Church. And so she set out on a journey to understand Church and to find her place in it.

Centered around seven sacraments, Evans' quest takes readers through a liturgical year with stories about baptism, communion, confirmation, confession, marriage, vocation, and death that are funny, heartbreaking, and sharply honest.

A memoir about making do and taking risks, about the messiness of community and the power of grace, *Searching for Sunday* is about overcoming cynicism to find hope and, somewhere in between, Church. Copies of the book will be available September  $1^{\rm st}$  for \$10. We'll begin having book discussions on Sunday, September  $15^{\rm th}$  during education hour at 9:30 a.m., or sign up to schedule a discussion group at another time or place during the week.

**GENERAL FUND** July GF income (4 weekends) was 5% less than last July (4 weekends). July expenses were 8% less than last July, primarily due to lower youth director and youth/family expense. Year-to-date GF income (30 weekends) is 16% more than prior year (30 weekends) and 2% more than budget. YTD expenses (excluding intern compensation, covered by a transfer from the Designated Fund) are 2% less than prior year, primarily due to lower mission outreach, staff support and maintenance expenses, partially offset by higher spiritual growth and office equipment costs; YTD expenses are 2% more than budget.

MORTGAGE REPAYMENT FUND July MRF income was slightly less than last July. Payments were equal to last July. YTD MRF income is less than prior year, which included a \$15,000 estate gift from Maxine Dimick, and is slightly less than budget. YTD payments are \$5,000 less than prior year, which included an additional \$15,000 principal payment and \$10,000 more than budget, due to an extra \$10,000 principal payment. Final payment is scheduled for October 2024.

## Want to Build a Shanty?

"Home improvement" has a different connotation in the shantytowns of Nairobi, Kenya than it does in Mount Horeb. There, you don't hire a general contractor to oversee the addition of a bathroom or sun room, or to renovate your kitchen. You hike along the narrow paths that serve as streets looking for discarded post-consumer waste materials and figure out what combination of corrugated metal scraps, hub caps pounded flat, and plastic jugs and remnants you need to patch up the gaps in your shack. Sanitation is a foreign concept, and electricity is unreliable at best, nonexistent at worst.

These are the living conditions for hundreds of kids who attend the two schools (New Dawn and Bethel Outreach) and an orphanage (The Nest) funded by SABA International. Those of you who have attended ELC for some time no doubt know of their amazing work over the past decade to uplift children in Kenya, encouraging them to rise above these conditions and pursue their dreams.

On Sept. 22, we'll add a new dimension to our understanding of the places SABA makes an impact. Cathy and Tim Woller will visit our congregation to share updates about their partner organizations in Nairobi, and we'll enlist our Sunday School classes (and any interested adults) to construct a shanty from discarded materials.

This exercise will provide our kids a better understanding of the conditions their peers in Kenya face -- and a better appreciation for the quality of life we are so blessed to have in our town.


