A NOTE from PASTOR JOHN

Rebuild, Repair, Restore

*Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt;
you shall raise up the foundations of many generations;
you shall be called the repairer of the breach,
the restorer of streets to live in. – Isaiah 58:12*

On Confirmation Day/Reformation Sunday in October, we read this verse from Isaiah. Isaiah had seen the division and eventual collapse of the nation and its people. If you were in worship last weekend, each of you should have received a child's building block, with the reminder that each of us is called to be an interconnected part of this body of Christ.

Peter would use much the same image: "Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house..." I Peter 2:5a. So the question I asked the confirmands is the same one that I put to myself and each of you: "How will you let your life become part of God's work of rebuilding, repairing, and restoring God's kingdom?"

It doesn't take much to look around and see that the old structures of church and community are in need of repair. What God builds for the days ahead will not be exactly as it was before. Every generation must adapt to the new conditions we face. The challenges for the church of this century are very different than the last. But whatever form it takes, we know that it will be built on the foundation of Christ's love, and that all people need to find a refuge and home within the boundless mercy which we share.

But without your presence, the breach remains unfilled, each of us has an important place and amazing gifts by which the whole body is strengthened. Together we are stronger, and we help one another. When any one person, one stone is missing, the whole structure is lessened. Your presence, your love, your life are so important to God, and to God's people.

Year-to-date General Fund income (39 weekends) is 10% more than prior year (39 weekends) and 2% less than budget. YTD expenses (excluding intern compensation, covered by a transfer from the Designated Fund) are 1% less than prior year, primarily due to lower mission outreach, insurance, and utilities, partially offset by higher spiritual growth expenses; YTD expenses are 1% more than budget, primarily due to spiritual growth, snow removal, and building maintenance, partially offset by savings in support staff.

Final payment is scheduled for September 2024.

BENEVOLENCE

Improving Local Health Care

We are all aware of the difficulties too many people have when it comes to receiving quality health care. At times it can seem like this problem is too large and too complex to fix, but local organizations can make a big difference on a small scale. We're fortunate to have two excellent ones in our area.

Community Connections Free Clinic in Dodgeville opened in 2006, and provides primary care services free of charge on a first-come, first-served basis every Tuesday and Thursday evening. The clinic is staffed by 127 medical and lay volunteers, and two part-time staff members, and relies on donations from individuals and churches for much of their funding.

Our Lady of Hope in Madison opened in 2009, and is a direct primary-care clinic that donates at least 55% of their services to care for uninsured patients consistent with Catholic health care tradition. They've found success with an uncommon model: about half of their patients pay a monthly membership fee in exchange for primary care, and about half of the clinic visits are provided for free to the uninsured.

Contributions received in November will be shared equally between these two non-profit organizations, which are doing wonderful healing work in our community. Please consider a gift towards these very worthy causes.

Altogether it adds up to a great blessing for the communities we serve in Kenya, and for that we say thank you.

In this broken and sin-worn world, the needs never end and the work goes on, so it's fitting that the humble dwelling remains on the lawn of ELC along Main Street for just a bit longer. Under the leadership of Adam Mertz, and with many helping hands from ELC, a small dwelling was built that is typical of homes in the developing world, including Kenya. While it helps us to ponder the physical realities of poverty, especially in contrast to our own dwellings, it's also meant to keep alive the conversation about dignity--our dignity comes from being created in the image of God, not from our physical possessions. Saba, International seeks to improve the physical realities of the Kenyans whom we serve because these are people with dignity, loved by God, worthy of knowing their creator and being given opportunities to flourish. We hope you take time to open your hearts wide, to explore this simple dwelling, to discuss it with friends and family and neighbors, to let God stir in your hearts. It was a pleasure sharing this message in three worship services and with the confirmation students also, and I thank you for giving us the opportunity to share about our work in Kenya for the past 12 years! Thanks to all of the people who committed time, resources and talent to this project.

Finally, as Christmas approaches, consider shopping with a purpose!! We will be hosting a sale on **Saturday, November 16 from 9-12** in the ELC Narthex. This will be going on during the indoor farmers' market. We will be selling lovely hand-made products which are crafted out of gorgeous African fabrics by the men and women of the Jacaranda Community. Come check out their products and take joy in knowing that 100% of your purchase will benefit the people who make these products. Jacaranda community supports an array of initiatives,

including a church, a school, plus medical and social outreach, all aimed at improving the lives of Kenyans seeking to break free from the grip of poverty. We hope to see you there!

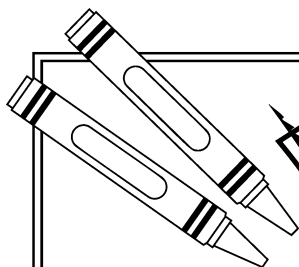
