Here's an excerpt of Jim McPherson's poem "December Humbug" which captured for me a little of this unease of the season:

DECEMBER HUMBUG - by Jim McPherson

December's wild collective madness strikes! We all submit like slaves to Santa's lash and with our hearts and minds and credit cards crown Santa as de facto Season King.

Remote from human suffering at the Pole, he speaks to those who dream of better things beyond injustice misery and toil to offer tinsel hope and brittle joy: "Just come to me, and I will bring relief my cargo cult will save you from your grief."

Give me the God whose feet have touched the ground and walked with us as human as ourselves to celebrate our joys and share our pain; who's borne injustice hunger and fatigue and who, foreswearing all escape, endured our human death: and Death's defeat secured.

I have no real need for a distant elf who has no real answers to the reality of human longing. I need the one who walks alongside us in the midst of real human life, bringing healing, hope, and forgiveness. I don't need more tinsel and hype; I need the light shining in the darkness: "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. The Statewide Impact of Lutheran Social Services

Lutheran Social Services is ingrained in so many aspects of care for people in need of assistance that it's hard to imagine what Wisconsin would be like without it. One of the largest nonprofits in the state, LSS works with partner organizations to develop innovative solutions to many of society's most complex and vexing problems, with a fundamental belief in the infinite worth of people they serve and a goal of helping them realize their potential.

LSS is perhaps most well-known for its work promoting and facilitating adoption and foster care, and for ensuring that disabled people and seniors receive the care they deserve. The organization also has initiated new mental health solutions, has strengthened its focus on tackling addiction — it will soon open a \$1.7 million recovery center in Waukesha — and is navigating new challenges, such as the lack of affordable housing in many urban areas. Notably, that housing shortage prompted LSS to stop resettling refugees in Madison earlier this year, which is a sad turn of events given the area's incredibly supportive and welcoming nature. Hopefully, they can return to that mission soon in conjunction with their affordable housing emphasis.

The Social Action Ministry Team believes in directing our congregation's Benevolence resources toward Lutheran organizations when possible — not simply as a matter of allegiance, but because of the infrastructure and expertise they have in place. LSS is a shining example of this commitment. Please consider a gift to the Benevolence Program in December to ensure that LSS continues to fight for people who might otherwise be left behind.
