# A NOTE from PASTOR JOHN

**PEOPLE OF YOUR LIGHT** *As we enter a new year I appreciate Walter Brueggemann's poem about this season:*

*Epiphany -- Walter Brueggemann (b. 1933)*

On Epiphany day,  
we are still the people walking.  
We are still people in the dark,  
and the darkness looms large around us,  
beset as we are by fear,  
anxiety,  
brutality,  
violence,  
loss —  
a dozen alienations that we cannot manage.

We are — we could be — people of your light.  
So we pray for the light of your glorious presence  
as we wait for your appearing;  
we pray for the light of your wondrous grace  
as we exhaust our coping capacity;  
we pray for your gift of newness that  
will override our weariness;  
we pray that we may see and know and hear and trust  
in your good rule.

That we may have energy, courage, and freedom to enact  
your rule through the demands of this day.  
We submit our day to you and to your rule, with deep joy and  
high hope.

Taken from his *Prayers for a Privileged People* (Nashville: Abingdon, 2008), p. 163.

I was particularly struck by that line: “We are—we could be—people of your light.” We have been given every gift necessary to be God’s light in the darkest of days, but we too often shrink back when the time comes for us to shine. We need to enter this new year with ‘deep joy and high hope’. We need to shine that light for each other during

this cold, dark season. We need to give the world around us reason to hope this new year.

November GF income (4 weekends) was 19% more than last November (4 weekends). November expenses were 5% less than last November, primarily due to lower office expenses. **YTD GF income** (47 weekends) is 8% more than prior year (47 weekends) and 4% less than budget. YTD expenses (excluding intern compensation, covered by a transfer from the Designated Fund) are 1% less than prior year, primarily due to lower mission outreach, pastoral expenses, & maintenance, partially offset by higher spiritual growth & technology expenses; YTD expenses are 1% more than budget, primarily due to spiritual growth, snow removal, and maintenance, partially offset by savings in mission outreach, pastoral expenses & support staff.

November BM fund income was more than last November. There were no expenses in either November. YTD Building Maintenance Fund income is less than prior year and budget. YTD expenses (boiler repair, entry carpet runners, fellowship hall replacement A/C unit, new sidewalk, and stone repairs) are more than last year (front door replacement) and budget.

YTD payments are \$5,000 less than prior year (which included an additional \$15,000 principal payment) and \$10,000 more than budget, due to an extra \$10,000 principal payment. Final payment is scheduled for September 2024.

**Message From Bishop Peter Rogness About the Election of Our Next Bishop** Town Hall Meetings to Take Place January and February, 2020. The foundation begins to be laid by first naming where we are as a synod, and, from that, what kind of leadership skills we need to seek in the next person to serve as our bishop. This is fundamental to a good call process in any congregation, and just as fundamental for us as a synod.

We encourage broad participation in this step. We will center on two descriptions: (a) this synod – its strengths and challenges, what makes it unique, what is it facing at this moment in history; and, from that snapshot, (b) the skills and characteristics that would serve us well in the person of the next bishop. That emerging “bishop profile” will be the lens through which further consideration of potential nominees will happen. I will have a team of scribes to gather the observations of all who attend. They will then condense what has emerged from those meetings into a profile of the synod, and a profile of the bishop we seek.

We suggest that those who will ultimately be present to represent your congregation in the assembly that will vote for the next bishop would be logical attendees. But these meetings are not legislative, and any interested members of our congregations are welcome to come.

The Town Hall Meeting for our location will be held at **St. James Lutheran in Verona on January 18 beginning at 10 am.**

## **WOMEN OF ELC – PLEASE READ**

On Saturday, December 7, The Women of ELC met for the annual Advent Brunch and elections meeting. Carlyce Skjervem, wearing a lovely bunad, showed us her Hardanger fiddle and shared stories and music. Duane and Nancy Kittleson wore their traditional Bunads and explained the elements and care techniques. Did you know that you clean a bunad by hanging it outside when it's snowing? The brunch was served by Social Committee #10, Diane Pladziewicz and Wendy Rasmussen co-chairs. Thank you, Committee #10, for the lovely meal. Kathy O'Donnell accompanied our carol singing and we closed with The Lord's Prayer.

The election portion of the meeting was non-productive. No one was nominated to take over as president of the organization. As a result, The Women of ELC is dissolving.

**What does this mean??** All of our remaining funds will be sent to the churchwide Women of the ELCA. We will find out from them what to do with any of our historical records.

As individuals, we are still Women of the ELCA. It is only our local unit that is dissolving. Individuals are always invited to participate in the Barneveld Conference Spring Gathering held annually, The South-Central Wisconsin Synodical Women's Organization's conventions and retreats, held in alternate years, and The Triennial Gathering held every three years. We can still have service, Bible study, and book study groups. We can *at any time* revive the unit by meeting a few basic criteria.

**What will change??** The women's organization will no longer coordinate Lutheran Social Services' Operation Christmas, Lutheran World Relief's Kits and Quilts drive, or gatherings like the Advent Brunch and Spring Fling. Funeral lunch committees are asked to continue into 2020 to give the church council a chance to decide how to handle funeral lunches.

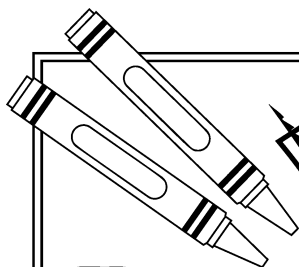

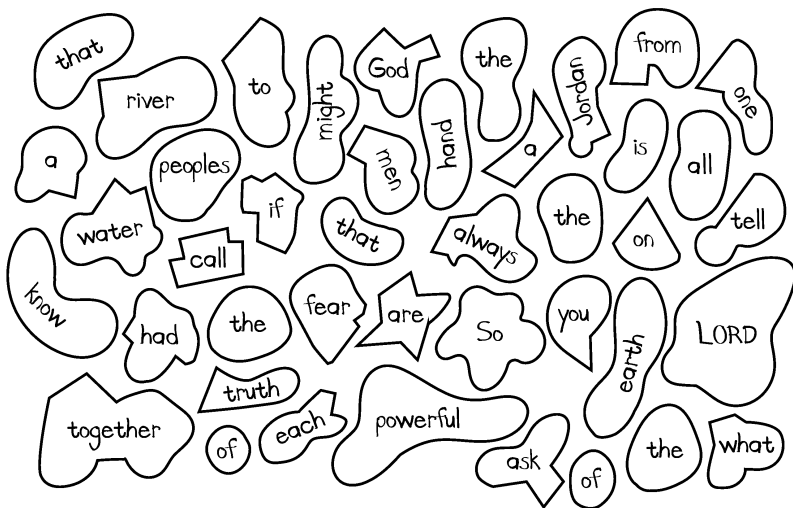
