A NOTE from PASTOR JOHN

Church: the living body of Christ

"Christianity isn't meant to be simply believed; it's meant to be lived, shared, eaten, spoken, and enacted in the presence of other people. They reminded me that, try as I may, I can't be a Christian on my own. I need a community. I need the Church."

(Searching for Sunday, p. xvi)

Our Sunday morning adult class has been discussing a book by the late Rachel Held Evans, "Searching for Sunday: loving, leaving, and finding the church" In this very personal reflection, she details her struggle to find a meaningful, faithful relationship with God after walking away from her childhood church and looking at many ways to experience faith.

As we've shared her journey, she keeps coming back to the thought expressed above. That is, the church, and Christian faith are not about thinking and saying just the right things, but seeing, touching, and knowing the church in all of our life. Church is not a bunch of doctrines or creeds, but it is the presence of God in the people, the eating, drinking, talking, hugging, listening, singing, showing up, and caring.

Sometimes I'm afraid we think of 'ministry' only as things like worship, communion, and teaching. But we all share in the ministry of caring, serving, and lived day to day. So in addition to baptism and communion, God's presence is experienced in your presence in worship, your smile for a neighbor, the lunch served after a funeral, We need to think about church as more than membership in an organization, or gathering on Sunday morning, but also a being the visible, human community which embodies all the ups and downs of human life, sharing our struggles and our triumphs, and always welcoming those who feel that they have family in faith.

Year-to-date General Fund income (53 weekends) is 9% more than prior year (52 weekends) and 2% more than budget. YTD expenses (net of transfer-in that covered intern compensation) of \$330,190 are 2% less than the \$336,942 net expense in the prior year, primarily due to lower mission outreach, support staff, pastoral ministry, youth/family, and maintenance costs, partially offset by higher spiritual growth, and pastor salary expenses; YTD net expenses are 0% above budget, with overages in spiritual growth, worship, snow removal, and maintenance costs, offset by savings in mission outreach, pastoral ministry, and support staff expense.

Year-to-date Building Maintenance Fund income is less than prior year and budget. YTD expenses (boiler repair, entry carpet runners, fellowship hall replacement A/C unit, new sidewalk, and stone repairs) are more than last year (front door replacement) and budget. The December transfer-in from the Designated Fund is the residual balances from several completed initiatives.

In the past, this event provided much of the funding that allowed us to provide clothes, footwear, and bedding for our neighbors in need throughout the year. In late 2018, we began to explore the needs in our community, and we decided to bring to life a new non-profit: **Neighbors Helping Neighbors, Inc.**

This year, we will bring the vision for that organization to life. We are creating a volunteer-driven outreach hub where people in need in our community can access free food, clothing and personal items, and information regarding other social services -- all under one roof. Our new facility in Mount Horeb will coordinate the ongoing efforts of organizations and initiatives such as the Community Clothes Closet of Mount Horeb, Mount Horeb School District Weekend* and Extended weekend meal program, and the Mount Horeb Community Supper. A unified effort will provide an effective outreach avenue to people in need of assistance, synergy in fundraising efforts, and more efficient management, collection and distribution of resources.

Our start-up and first-year operational costs will be significant -potentially in excess of \$60,000. The Love Offering signals the start
of our fundraising efforts to bring this vision to life. We will gladly

partners, as well as community supporters, starting the weekend of

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS TRAINING As many of you have certainly noted, our society is experiencing an increase in violent events. Unfortunately, we in Dane County are not immune to such disturbing incidents. Many community leaders, as well as citizens, are concerned about what they can or should do when confronted with these situations. During a Dane County Chief's of Police Association meeting, the notion arose regarding a unified message from Dane County Law Enforcement on civilian response to an active shooter situation. Current plans supported by research are "ALICE" (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter the Attack, Evacuate); "ADD" (Avoid, Deny, Defend), and "Run, Hide, Fight." It is important to know that oftentimes police response time may not be quick enough to intervene before significant injury or death occurs. It is imperative to have options in your plan to survive, not only in the workplace, but also in your life.

As a result of conversations which have taken place between law enforcement and community members, the Dane County Sheriff's **Office** is embarking on a FREE education and training initiative. On Tuesday, February 25th, 6:00pm-8:00pm, Dane County Deputy Josalyn Longley will be providing training at Mt. Horeb Evangelical Church, 315 E. Main St, Mt. Horeb. The presentation will provide training as well as education regarding active shooters and workplace violence. Topics will include resources for prevention information and potential early warning signs for all those in the community to be cognizant of. Through this initiative, we feel citizens will be empowered to take action and have the tools and action plans to survive. 
