A Note from PASTOR JOHN

The light still shines .

"No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house." -Matthew 5:15

If you've been listening to the daily devotions on Facebook, you'll recognize this story: In the old days, on Easter night, the Russian peasants used to carry the blessed fire home from church. The light would scatter and travel in all directions through the darkness, and the desolation of the night would be pierced and dispelled as lamps came on in the windows of the farmhouses, one by one. Even so, the glory of God sleeps everywhere, ready to blaze out unexpectedly in created things. Even so, his peace and his order lie hidden in the world, even the world of today, ready to reestablish themselves in his way, in his own good time-but never without the instrumentality of free options made by free people. *Thomas Merton*

In the Russian Orthodox tradition there is a fire lit as part of the Easter celebration. I love the image of that fire being carried out from the church and lighting the homes of all the people. This 'blessed fire' represents the resurrected Christ who lives in the lives and homes of all those in the community.

In these last few weeks I often find myself walking my dogs down the dark and quiet streets of town. On warm nights there have been campfires burning in backyards all around town. It makes me think of Merton's story – how the light of Christ spreads and is burning all over town.

In this time when we can't gather together, we are entrusted in keeping that fire burning in our own homes and own lives. We can nurture that flame in ourselves, and share a word to rekindle that fire in others. God's Spirit continues to kindle that fire, and it will not go out.

There will come a day when we gather again and sing, and pray, and let our light shine together as one, but until then, let your light shine where you are.

YTD expenses are 8% less than prior year, primarily due to the vacant intern position, lower maintenance and utility costs, partially offset by leadership development (synod assembly); YTD expenses are 5% under budget, primarily due to staff reductions, lower utilities and pastoral ministry costs.
