A Note from PASTOR JOHN

"O Lord God, you know"

Walking through the church building these days is a sobering experience. I feel a little like Ezekiel who told this vision: The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. He led me all round them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry.³He said to me, 'Mortal, can these bones live?'

Ezekiel 37:1-3a

Our beautiful church building that should be filled with life, noise, music and laughter, lies quiet, a little like Ezekiel's valley of dry bones. But I really feel akin to Ezekiel in his answer to God's question: "Mortal, can these bones live?" to which Ezekiel answers: "O Lord God, you know" (vs. 3b). In so many words Ezekiel says "I don't know", which I find myself saying so often these days. There are so many unknowns for the weeks and months ahead, and no one has answers right now.

But while Ezekiel doesn't have all the answers, he continues to listen. Then God proclaims: "I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. " (vs. 6) And there amidst the dry bones, Ezekiel sees the promise of new life.

There is so much I don't have answers for today, but when the quiet seems too much, I try to listen to what God might be saying. I don't know when, but I do know that life and music and laughter will return, and they've really never gone away. We can still sing God's song; we have the ability to reach out in love through a number of means, and there is still joy and laughter even when we can't be in one place. For we are people beloved by the one who said "I will be with you always" (Mt. 28:20).



COUNCIL NEWS

ANNUAL MEETING NOMINATION PROCESS IS BEGINNING Our Congregation's annual meeting is staring some of us in the face even though it is a couple months away. A very important aspect is the election of our Congregation Council. The Nominating Committee that was elected last November has the following members responsible for obtaining nominations for the Council and all the elected committees of ELC. Those folks are Sandy Fischer,-Gary Hastings, Kris Kiel, Lindsay Schulenberg and Diane Twiton

They have a big job this year, as last year we were unable to obtain sufficient nominations to fill 12 Council seats. Council terms are 2 years with a maximum of 6 consecutive years. This is a big responsibility with huge rewards especially in the upcoming years. How do we "church"? What changes/adjustments need to be made to accommodate what is happening in our world, state and community? We need committed members to help make this happen.

This year we recognize Bruce Meister who has served his 3 two-year terms and is no longer eligible for reelection. (However, he can stay out one year and put himself in nomination again!) Bruce has served as Vice-President and is very involved in the technology improvements that have been done the past 6 years. Thank you, Bruce!

There are four council members whose terms are up and are still eligible to run. Two have agreed to run again, one is moving up north and one hasn't responded yet.

In addition to the Council, these are the other elected offices:

- Audit Committee needs one new member
- Endowment Committee needs one new members
- Nominating Committee needs six new members (one year term)
- Personnel Ministry needs three new members
- Synod Voting Members needs three adults one male, one female, one either and two youth/young adult (age 21 and under

The Nominating Committee is charged with beginning the important work of securing nominations for the Council, Audit, Endowment, Nominating, Personnel and Synod Voting. The best scenario would be to have more than enough to select from to again have a council of 12 members as well as filling the numbers needed for all the elected positions.

Year-to-date General Fund income (30 Sundays) is 12% less than prior year (30 Sundays) and 18% less than budget. YTD expenses are 15% less than prior year, primarily due to the vacant intern position, fewer staff hours, and lower Leadership Development, Spiritual Growth, Pastoral Ministry, Youth & Family, Maintenance, Utility, and Administrative costs; YTD expenses are 13% under budget, primarily due to pay reductions (2nd half March and 1st half April), fewer staff hours (July), lower Leadership Development, Spiritual Growth, Pastoral Ministry, Youth/Family, Maintenance, Utility, and Administrative costs. There is \$39,972 in the cash balance that we drew from our SBA Paycheck Protection Program loan account. We expect this loan to be forgiven later this year, at which time we will recognize this as income.

Year-to-date Building Maintenance Fund income is 41% more than prior year and 26% more than budget. YTD expenses (HVAC repair, tree pruning and wall repair) are 40% more than last year (HVAC, carpet runners) and 48% less than budget.

Year-to-date Mortgage Repayment Fund income is 21% less than prior year and 23% less than budget. YTD payments are equal to budget and 28% less than prior year (we made an extra \$10,000 principal payment last year). Final payment is scheduled for June 2024. The cash balance includes \$1,340 from the SBA loan for Apr/May interest. When the loan is forgiven, we will recognize this as income.

BENEVOLENCE

Dear friends of Saba, International at ELC,

One year ago Saba, International was laying plans for constructing a humble dwelling on the lawn of ELC that would replicate what housing in a slum community is like. As you read this, a new dwelling is being built for the director of Bethel Outreach, Mary Adinda. Her home was severely damaged one night during April due to heavy rains. After months of behind-the-scenes work, Saba International is partnering with a U.S.-based organization called Seven Hills Global Outreach, and a Kenyan-based group called FOCUS to construct a simple and secure dwelling for Mary, complete with a toilet!! The funds raised for this project constitute a salary compensation for Mary that dates back to the beginning of Saba's partnership with Bethel in 2012. She's never taken a salary as Director! We pray God's blessing over this dwelling and over this wonderfully sacrificial lady.

The school was promptly closed in March as quarantine against the coronavirus set in. Life in Kenya screeched to a halt, which meant that day-laborers lost work and income overnight, and very few had any margin whatsoever. Mary and her cook continued to feed their students and their families, and Saba has been pleased to continue to fund their feeding program.

Full quarantine has lifted and some work has resumed, but Kenyans will not return to school in 2020. This affects all of the programs with which Saba partners, and we will continue to pray for and fund each organization as their daily work shifts due to the global pandemic. New Dawn School will use the next several months to accomplish much-needed repair work on their facility.

The Nest Children's Home continues to rescue and protect children whose mothers are imprisoned, babies who are abandoned and need care until they are placed for adoption, and young women who are pregnant due to incest. Normally the Nest sends many of their older children out to boarding schools, but now they have all of the children in-house all of the time. This means they must secure more food on a daily basis, but they also have more helping hands for the work which must be done. Kenya imposed strict mask-wearing policies and curfews from the start, and people are mostly inclined to abide by all of this--Kenyans realize how vulnerable they are as a nation, because their medical infrastructure lacks the resources for meeting the needs of people who fall sick. Sadly, there has been an increase in police brutality in enforcing curfew and mask-wearing, and increased reports of incest and rape. All of this affects the communities with whom we partner, and we invite you to pray with us that The Nest, New Dawn and Bethel Outreach will continue to be the light of Christ in the darkness and brokenness, and that they will continue to hold out the hope of God's love to a desperate world.

Thank you, ELC for actively journeying with us for the past 11 years as we offer prayers and gifts, so that these three communities can know that they are loved and remembered and valuable.

Thank you, ELC for giving us the opportunity to receive your September Benevolence offering. May we find joy in helping meet the needs of our neighbors, no matter the miles between us!

Dear ELC members,

Many of you have helped out in making lunches for the **HOMELESS PROGRAM** in Madison over the years. Here's an update on how this effort has continued during the pandemic, and how you might still help. Thank you!

Good afternoon,

I wanted to give everyone a little update on the shelter and share a need for the men. Everything continues to go well at the Warner Park emergency shelter. The numbers have been much higher than they normally would be for this time of year. We are already seeing consistent numbers in the 90's. The City is looking for a new location but has not identified anything suitable at this time. We will be able to stay at Warner Park until a replacement location has been found. The meals continue to be provided by Food Fight catering and that is going fine. Though the men do complain a little "too small of portions" and "not enough meat". They miss you all and your delicious meals and kindness.

We continue to do nightly health assessments on each man prior to entering shelter. We started COVID- 19 testing last week and will do so every two weeks. The participation was lower than we had hoped. Men were concerned they would get kicked out if they got tested, that it was only for systematic people and of course getting a stick shoved up your nose wasn't too enticing. So we are going to try something new for testing on August 17th and September 3rd.

We are in need of \$5 gift cards to be used as incentives for the men's shelter guests to "encourage" them to get Covid 19 tested when it is done onsite 8/17 and 9/3 at Warner Park. You can mail or drop off gift cards at Brooks or mail funds and make an online donation at below link and I will go purchase. Gift cards from McDonalds or Walgreens are great examples of places our guests can easily get to.


