
Most of all we rejoice that the true celebration of life will arrive no matter what, as we look ahead to proclaiming Christ's victory at Easter!

Through my sharing of my own experiences and my own passions of social justice, I have had individuals ask me for resources and book suggestions. Following are a list of books I would highly recommend to anyone who is interested in deepening your own knowledge and ponderings in these topics as well.

- Faith in Action: A Handbook for Activists, Advocates, and Allies by Fortress Press
 - Give snapshots of many different topics, with some statistics, as well as actionable steps to take to be an advocate & ally for each topic.

- Strength for the Struggle by Joseph Ellwanger
 - The author is a retired Lutheran pastor and shares the experiences as his congregations (in Birmingham, AL & Milwaukee, WI) looked to filling the needs of their community and world with those in their communities.
- <u>Dear Church: A Love Letter from a Black Preacher to the Whitest Denomination in the US</u> by Lenny Duncan
 - The author, a non-straight black Lutheran pastor, writes of his experiences as a black man in the Lutheran Church and calls people of faith to action.
- <u>I'm Still Here: Black Dignity in a World Made for Whiteness</u> by Austin Channing Brown
 - This is a personal account of what growing up as a black, Chrisitan, woman in America was like and speaks on how the ideals of 'diversity' often fall short.
- <u>Between the World and Me</u> by Ta-Nehisi Coates
 - This book was written as a letter to the author's son explaining his own experiences growing up as a black man as well as give details of our country's history that have profoundly impacted people of color.
- The Cross and the Lynching Tree by James Cone
 - Theologian, James Cone, explores the interconnection of the symbols of the cross and the lynching tree within history and in the lives of people of color.

There are of course many more, great books out there on these topics but these are some of the books I have personally read and found impactful. If anyone would like to discuss any of these books or topics or have other good book suggestions, please let me know! These topics are important to me as I continue to strive to be a witness of God's love out in the world.

Year-to-date General Fund income (5 Sundays) is 17% more than prior year (4 Sundays) and 25% less than budget. YTD expenses are 8% less than prior year, primarily due to fewer staff hours and savings in various Congregational Life expenses and Maintenance, partially offset by the cost of having an intern this January; YTD expenses are 9% under budget, primarily due to fewer staff hours, savings in various Congregational Life expenses, and the net effect of timing variances (Insurance, Utilities under budget; Maintenance/Snow Removal and Technology over budget).


