A Note from PASTOR JOHN

"You will receive power..."

"So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' ⁷He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' "Acts 1:6-8

This passage is the beginning of the Ascension Day story, which we seldom get to read as it always falls on a Thursday. But this year I found it a particularly thought provoking. The story begins with confusion "Lord is this the time?". The disciples had just come through a time of unimaginable events. From days of great success to dark times of fear and pain, to a new day and new possibilities. But they aren't clear how to move forward.

Does that sound familiar? We've been on a journey over the last year and more. A journey from days of security and success, to days of fear and pain, and now are seeing new possibilities opening around us nearly every day.

In their moment of confusion, those first disciples didn't receive explicit instructions, but they did receive a promise. "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you."

We are recipients of that same promise, that same Spirit, and that same power. We may not be sure exactly what the next steps are each and every day, but we can be sure that God has still called us to be witnesses both here, and around the world.

What do you feel the Spirit calling you to do as a witness to God's love in Christ?

New Worship Schedule and Practice

As the Covid-19 public health emergency comes to an end, our summer schedule will look a lot more like what we're accustomed to. Beginning in June, the following changes will be made:

- There will on one worship service at 9:00 AM Sunday
- We will discontinue pre-registration and usher's recording attendance
- We will again be serving coffee and donuts on Sunday morning
- In accordance with CDC guidelines it will no longer be necessary for fully vaccinated people to wear masks.
 - We expect that unvaccinated people will continue to wear masks
 - Anyone should feel free to continue to wear a mask if that makes you more comfortable
- We will be looking a holding one or more outdoor worship services this summer.
- The pre-recorded online worship will continue to be available (though the premiere time may be adjusted) Eventually we hope to simply live-stream the worship from the sanctuary, which would remain available to watch throughout the week.
- We are still studying the guidance on safe singing practices and will set a policy so that we may begin singing together as well.
- If attendance grows, we will consider adding additional worship opportunities.

Dear Siblings in Christ,

God created all people in Gods divine image & calls you good. June is celebrated as Pride month within the Gay/Queer/LGBTQIA+community due to events that increased visibility, awareness, and acceptance in the late 60s (ie. Stonewall Riots, NYC). We have come far in recognizing the beauty of human diversity, but yet there is still restrictive and harmful legislation introduced, hate crimes continue, & people continue to die for being who God created them to be.

The following list are books highly recommend for those who are interested in deepening your understanding to topics of LGBTQIA+ in regard to religion and faith in honor of Pride month:

- Transforming: The Bible and the Lives of Transgender Christians by Austen Hartke-Weaves together discussion of scripture and personal stories of transgender Christians, as well as includes discussions of language around gender.
- One Coin Found: How God's Love Stretches to the Margins by Emmy Kegler-The author, a queer Lutheran pastor, wrestles with faith and scripture, finding it full of Gods promise to always find & bring back those often pushed to the edges.
- Queer Virtue: What LGBTQ People Know about Life and Love and how it Can Revitalize Christianity - by Liz Edmon A look at Christian theology & queer ethics, Edmon urges that Christianity, at scriptural core challenges readers to break false binaries that pit people against each other.
- Torn: Rescuing the Gospel from the Gays vs. Christians Debate by Justin Lee-The author, a gay man and devout Christian, bridges the gaps between his faith and sexuality in this insightful and touching memoir.

- Welcoming and Affirming: A Guide to Supporting and Working with LGBTQ+ Christian Youth - by Leigh Finke (Companion to Queerfully and Wonderfully Made)- Personal testimonials are shared from young adults who have experienced the joys and hardships of being queer and Christian.
- Unashamed: A Coming Out Guide for LGBTQ Christians by Amber Cantorna-Tackling the often asked question of 'how does one reconcile their sexuality with their faith?' Encouraging all Christians to embrace their identities & celebrate Gods creation.
- Unclobbered: Rethinking Our Misuse of the Bible on Homosexuality - by Colby Martin-The book reexamines the frequently quoted passages used against our LGBTQ+ siblings, while bringing stories from the author's life

April General Fund income (4 Sundays) was 31% less than last April (4 Sundays). April expenses were 17% more than last April, primarily due to adding an intern and the fact that last April included a leadership development refund. Year-to-date General Fund income (17 Sundays) is 8% less than prior year (17 Sundays) and 23% less than budget. YTD expenses are 5% more than prior year, primarily due to adding an intern, staff raises, and higher worship, snow removal, and utilities costs, partially offset by fewer staff hours and savings in various Congregational Life expenses; YTD expenses are 9% under budget, primarily due to fewer staff hours and savings in utilities and various Congregational Life expenses, partially offset by higher outreach, insurance (timing), and snow removal costs.

April Building Maintenance Fund income was 2% more than last April. April 2021 expenses were for tree services, retaining wall repair, and replacing eaves troughs and gutters. April 2020 expenses were for tree pruning Year-to-date Building Maintenance Fund income is 1% less than prior year and 2% more than budget. YTD expense is for new eaves troughs and gutters, tree services, and repairs to stone including a retaining wall. Prior year expense was for HVAC repairs and tree pruning.
