## A Note from PASTOR JOHN

### Rebuilding

I will restore the fortunes of my people Israel, and they shall rebuild the ruined cities and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and drink their wine, and they shall make gardens and eat their fruit. Amos 9:14

More than once throughout the history of God's people, we have faced the prospect of 'rebuilding'. Thirty-seven years ago last month I stood in the ruins of my childhood church building in Barneveld after the tornado, and it seemed an overwhelming task. But with perseverance, prayer, hard work, and God's strength, a village, a community, and a congregation grew into something new again.

Now, of course, the past year did not leave us with the ruins of broken buildings, but there's still a lot that we've lost over the past year. But God's people have been here before, and God's strength and healing are always present. What's needed from us is the perseverance, prayer, creativity, and hard work that rebuilding always takes.

There are many decisions to be made about the next right steps. The new building we erected in Barneveld was similar, but not the same as what was there before. We are blessed to have a wonderful building, but we need to rebuild our worshiping community, our education efforts, our fellowship life, our service to others, and our outreach into the community. Let's proceed with faith, confidence, and joy in rebuilding a community of faith that can be a powerful witness to Christ's love, and a servant presence within our community.

Throughout this newsletter you'll see expanding opportunities to return to more familiar practices, but we need your creative input in expanding this ministry! God's Peace.

May General Fund income (5 Sundays) was 9% less than last May (5 Sundays). May expenses were 2% less than last May, primarily due to fewer staff hours and no leadership development cost, partially offset by adding an intern. Year-to-date General Fund income (22 Sundays) is 8% less than prior year (22 Sundays) and 22% less than budget. YTD expenses are 4% more than prior year, primarily due to adding an intern, staff raises, snow removal and utilities' costs, partially offset by fewer staff hours and savings in various Congregational Life and administrative expenses. YTD expenses are 11% under budget, primarily due to fewer staff hours and savings in utilities and various Congregational Life expenses, partially offset by higher outreach and snow removal costs.

May Building Maintenance income was 2% more than last May. May 2021 expenses were for lawn grading, reseeding and landscaping. There were no May 2020 expenses. YTD Building Maintenance income is 0% less than prior year and 4% more than budget. YTD expense is for new eaves troughs and gutters, tree services, grading/landscaping and repairs to stone, including a retaining wall. Prior year expense was for HVAC repairs and tree pruning.

# BENEVOLENCE

### Helping Build Dreams and Recover from Nightmares

If you're looking for some news that warms your heart, scroll through the posts on the Facebook page for **Habitat for Humanity of Dane County**, our July mission for the Benevolence Program. I won't do it justice, because the beaming smiles on the faces of families moving into new homes that they helped build through sweat equity says much more than I could relay in this space. It's a look of true joy. Of pride. Of hope.

Too often these days, we have trouble finding common ground on solutions to some of society's most vexing problems. It's hard to imagine someone finding fault with Habitat, the organization started by former President Jimmy Carter, because it has been so effective at selling an idea that almost everyone can understand and support. New homeowners have earned their shot by first investing their time helping others achieve their dream of having a house, and in return they get a no-interest payment plan so they can afford to maintain their place. Current and retired tradesmen enjoy lending their talents to construction, while passing along some skills to other volunteers. And I should note that Habitat now takes on a good share of renovation projects, recognizing that many times the obstacle to staying in a house is upkeep.

Just as Habitat helps people achieve their dreams, our August missions -- **Lutherans United Assisting After Disasters (LUAD**) and ELCA Disaster Relief -- help people rebuild when they've lived through a nightmare. LUAD is a local organization that comes to the aid of communities in ELCA's South-Central Synod of Wisconsin, while ELCA Disaster Relief is a national and even global service.

LUAD has a long history of helping communities in southwest Wisconsin recover after floods; they were a massive help during the brutal summer of 2018. They make an impact in other ways, too, like donating \$10,000 earlier this year to local organizations providing COVID-19 pandemic relief. It's important to know that LUAD serves the whole community, not just Lutherans. They work with local emergency offices and welcome anyone who wants to volunteer. LUAD would love to have a liaison from ELC to alert them to situations that arise in our area. If you're interested, please reach out to me.


