I learned this song 25 years ago when I was serving the Fagernes Lutheran Church outside of Blair, WI. We sang it for the 125th anniversary of that congregation. We were back last month to celebrate the 150th anniversary, and had a great afternoon recalling stories with old friends from that tiny congregation.

Now in November we once again mark All Saints' Sunday, and spend time remembering all those dear friends who have completed their course on earth and new rest with the Lord. With each passing year I feel like the chorus of the 'saints who've gone on before' is growing louder and louder in my soul. From members of my immediate family, to the many from my church family, the memories of those lives lived in faith fill my mind and tug at my heart.

At the same time, I begin to wonder about the witness you and I are leaving. Let us remember what has been done for us, and sing songs of faith in our worship and our work that will carry the faith into the next generations!!

YTD expenses are 11% more than prior year, primarily due to mission outreach/synod gifts specified in the estate gift, staff raises, full year of youth director, leadership development, pastoral ministry, youth & family, dishwasher repairs, development, supplies, web/technology, and utilities; YTD expenses are 3% more than budget, primarily due to the mission outreach/synod gifts, snow removal (timing), dishwasher repairs, supplies, and development, partially offset by youth & family expenses under budget.

New Programs Showcase Lutheran Social Services' Reach

Scrolling through the Facebook page for Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula is a great way to be reminded of the mind-boggling range of initiatives that organization leads.

They're probably most familiar for their work in foster care and adoption. But they also offer programs and services for addiction treatment, senior housing, mental health, and family assistance.

Two such efforts really leap off the page:

- This fall, LSS launched its School-Centered Mental Health pilot program, which aims to help students who struggle with mental health issues, including self-harm, grief after losing a parent, self-esteem issues, stress, depression and anxiety. These school-based programs bring licensed mental health professionals to students during the school day, overcoming common challenges including health insurance coverage and cost.
- In July, LSS expanded its IRIS services to all 72 counties in Wisconsin. This program provides adults with disabilities a road map for self-directed care, which gives them independence — a luxury many of us take for granted.

We'd all do well to live by the three LSS principles:

Act compassionately. Serve humbly. Lead courageously.

GOD'S WORK. OUR HANDS Thank you to everyone who came out to help with the God's Work. Our Hands service day on Sept. 30. We had over 50 volunteers participate and we accomplished a lot! Here it is, by the numbers:

- 65 pews in the Sanctuary and Chapel vacuumed and washed.
- 30 birthday bags stuffed for the Mt Horeb Food Pantry totaling around 100 pounds of birthday party items (cake mix, frosting, decorations, etc).
- 10 dozen monster cookies baked, bagged and frozen for the homeless lunches. A few dozen cutout cookies were also baked to be given to MH first responders.
- 6 fleece blankets tied for LWR.
- 5 dozen note cards decorated to be added to homeless lunches and sent to our homebound members.
- 3 dozen lunch bags decorated for Ronald McDonald House and homeless lunches.
- 20 window blinds in the Fellowship Hall washed.
- A few volunteers sorted clothes and food at The Clothes Closet and MH Food Pantry.
- Numerous windows were washed, lots of yardwork accomplished and we even unclogged one member's downspout!

are required at check-in. Eligible donors must be at least 17 years old, or 16 years old with a signed Red Cross parental/guardian consent form where state permits, must weigh at least 110 pounds and be in general good health.

THANKOFFERINGS are a long-standing custom among Lutheran women. We give in thanksgiving for blessings received—and we do receive so many blessings, don't we? And we are so grateful. That's why we give Thankofferings. Your generous Thankofferings help support the ongoing ministries of our churchwide women's organization, including our triennial conventions, the work of your elected churchwide board, the annual conference of synodical presidents, our communications ministries, justice and advocacy work, and so much more. It's been shown time and again that gratitude is good for us – spiritually, mentally, and even physically. Making a Thankoffering is gratitude in action, and Women of the ELCA is grateful to you for taking that action. Thank you.

Here at ELC, we will be gathering our **Thankofferings on November 17 & 18** at all services. If you have been collecting coins all year, please convert the amount to a check or larger bills for ease of counting.

WOMEN'S OFFERINGS: A BRIEF HISTORY The idea of collecting donations in small offering boxes goes back to the very early 1800s, when women formed "mite" or "cent" societies to raise money. Mite boxes were given out as fundraising tools to collect pennies for the support of church projects and foreign missionaries.

The earliest American Lutheran women's missionary society was founded in New York in 1837 to financially support the education and ordination of foreign missionaries from their synod. In 1879, the first national American Lutheran women's missionary society, the General Synod's Women's Home and Foreign Missionary Society, was founded. The original reason behind the creation? Funds were needed to financially support two young women who wanted to be foreign missionaries but were denied funding by the Board of Missions. A national women's structure was born!

The General Synod's Women's Home and Foreign Missionary Society created their first Thankoffering service in 1889 to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the organization. At that first Thankoffering, \$6,100 was collected. Today, Women of the ELCA

collects more than \$1 million in Thankofferings annually for the ministries and mission of our women's organization.


