By the time you read this, Christmas music will have been playing on the radio in the Madison area for a few weeks already, thrilling some and enraging Thanksgiving enthusiasts like my oldest daughter.

At whatever juncture you decided to get into the spirit of the season and tune in, you'll probably hear a song a group of British and Irish chart-toppers recorded in the early 1980s called "Do They Know It's Christmas?" The all-star group was pulled together in response to TV reports of the extensive famine in Ethiopia, with all proceeds going to benefit the hungry in a place where survival took the place of holiday celebrations.

Sadly, despite 40 years of global progress in many areas, hunger remains a fact of life for more than 800 million people – 11% of our planet's population. Some live in Ethiopia, some in Central America, some in far-flung cities across the U.S. and some right down the block from all of us.

Working with and through our congregations, ELCA World Hunger is uniquely positioned to reach communities in need. 
