Year-to-date income (47 weekends), including \$4,250 from the Maxine Dimick estate, is 3% less than prior year (48 weekends) and 9% under budget. YTD expenses are 8% more than prior year, primarily due to mission outreach/synod gifts specified in the estate gift, staff raises, full year of youth director, leadership development, coffee, pastoral ministry, worship support, youth & family, maintenance/dishwasher repairs, supplies, technology, development, and utilities; YTD expenses are 1% more than budget, primarily due to the mission outreach gifts, maintenance/dishwasher, supplies, and development, partially offset by youth/family and insurance under budget.

Year-to-date income, including \$2,500 from the Maxine Dimick estate, is less than prior year (which had \$9,800 in gifts from Endowment, \$47,698 from the Anna Halverson estate, and \$81,402 from the Designated Fund for stained glass repairs) and more than budget. YTD expenses, for the front door replacement, are less than the prior year which had outlays for the coffee station (covered by Endowment), refrigerator, and stained glass repair project.
