A Note from PASTOR JOHN

"Whatever it takes"

"To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, so that I might by any means save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings." 1 Corinthians 9:20-23

I've said more than once over the last months: "I wasn't trained for this" and "I'm not sure how we do things under these conditions". These are extraordinary times in which to proclaim the gospel. So many of the comfortable and familiar forms of ministry simply aren't safe to practice right now. But that doesn't mean that ministry is at a standstill. We simply need to do what generations of disciples before us have done – adapt.

Paul expresses that necessity in his letter to the Corinthians. Here was Paul, trained as a Pharisee, prepared to live his life in the safe confines of Israel, in the traditional practice of his Jewish faith, now travelling the known world, and finding a way to proclaim the message of Jesus in whatever place, time, and circumstance he faced.

We may be in the same geography as we were a year ago, but we are living in a 'different world' right now, with no clear roadmap to follow. But we do know who to follow. Our tasks is to listen to the call of God in Christ Jesus, and use the gifts we have to share that good news in whatever way presents itself. We do have tools to work with. The age-old gifts of speaking, listening, compassion, and intercession, along with modern tools of communication – as simple as a written note or phone call, to video-conferencing and streaming worship experiences. The same Spirit with strengthened Paul's ministry will see us through these days, and the church of Jesus Christ will remain.



Agape greetings and blessings to you all!



COUNCIL NEWS

TECHNOLOGY NEEDS It is hard to believe, but it has been over 6 months since we have been able to meet in the sanctuary for worship together. At that time, we transitioned to recording worship services and posting them on Facebook and YouTube. It has been a learning experience for all involved, and we appreciate all those who have participated in the services virtually, providing music, readings, etc., as well as the continued financial support being provided to maintain our ministry here at ELC.

While we have been able to meet together through parking lot services, it would appear that we will need to maintain recording services well into the new year, when hopefully conditions change and we will be able to gather in person again. To complete the recordings, we have been using borrowed equipment from a member to record and produce the videos. Given the need to continue recording, it is time to consider purchasing equipment for the church, to reduce the reliance on this borrowed equipment.

What we are considering purchasing is a camera, tripod, wireless lapel microphone, video editing software, and a lighting kit. The total cost for this is approximately \$800. The major portion of this expense will be the camera which represents approximately \$600 of this cost. This will essentially maintain our current video capabilities, but utilize all church owned equipment.

We have a member who has pledged to match the first \$300 of donations to help fund the purchase of this equipment. If you are interested in supporting what has become an important part of our ministry during these strange times, we would appreciate your support.

BENEVOLENCE

Community Clinics Provide Timely Support

Health care has been in the news every day for the past eight months, and it's been front of mind for more than a decade now as people and governmental agencies try to figure out how to navigate skyrocketing costs. The acute issues raised by the COVID-19 pandemic have stressed our health care system and made it even more important that we have a safety net for people facing financial challenges to get the medical attention they need.

So, for the second straight year, we are supporting a pair of community health centers through the Benevolence Program. Our Lady of Hope in Madison and Community Connections Free Clinic in Dodgeville.

Our Lady of Hope is a direct primary care clinic that was founded by two local doctors in 2009 and operates in the Catholic health tradition. It was established to address the issue of lack of primary medical care for the uninsured in the Madison area. The clinic donates at least 55% of our services to care for uninsured patients, made possible by donations. However, the majority of our financial support comes from their member patients. And the consistent growth of their members has allowed the clinic to add a second provider in April of 2019..

Community Connections has a mission to provide basic health care for those who cannot afford or access medical services in Iowa County and surrounding areas. CCFC's guiding principle is that, together, we can eliminate the obstacles to health care in our community, one patient at a time. There is no charge to see providers, and prescription medications are provided at little or no cost as needed. Their work is accomplished by 90 medical and lay volunteers and just one paid staff person, and is supported generously by donations from local individuals, churches, businesses and organizations, as well as grants and fundraising events.

These two centers offer much-needed care to vulnerable populations, at a crucial time. You can donate by:
