A Note from PASTOR JOHN

Another season

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. Ecclesiastes 3:1

The old preacher who wrote this passage so long ago tried to take the 'long view' of things, and recognized that seasons come and go with a wide variety of events throughout history. These seasons are beyond our control and not predictable. There are days I can appreciate the view of Ecclesiastes, but I'll admit my impatience and frustration as well.

We've just endured a year that took a very unexpected turn last March, and we enter this new year in hopes that it will bring a new season of hope, life and growth. I wish I could confidently say that we're already into that new season, and that before long we may return to many of the things we've missed – gathering for worship, singing together, socializing with large groups and extended families, and mostly an end to the uncertainties about the health and safety of our families and community.

We've sought to continue the worship and work of the ministry in new ways, while avoiding unnecessary risks to the health of our members and the larger community. Unfortunately, I've seen what this virus has done to members of my extended family, colleagues in ministry, and members of the congregation. We all hope that advances in medicine and vaccines will turn the tide in coming months, but until then we remain faithful in this season of life.

TREASURER'S REPORT November 2020 Financial Report

Year-to-date General Fund income (48 Sundays) is 9% less than prior year (47 Sundays) and 20% less than budget. YTD expenses are 13% less than prior year, primarily due to the Jan-Jul intern vacancy, fewer staff hours, and lower Leadership Development, Spiritual Growth, Pastoral Ministry, Youth & Family, Maintenance, Administrative, and Utilities costs; YTD expenses are 18% under budget, primarily due to free intern housing, fewer staff hours, disability insurance timing, and lower Leadership Development, Spiritual Growth, Pastoral Ministry, Youth & Family, Maintenance, Administrative, and Utilities costs: There is \$39,972 in the cash balance from our SBA Paycheck Protection Program Ioan. We expect this Ioan to be forgiven later this year, at which time we will recognize this as income.

Year-to-date Building Maintenance Fund income is 24% more than prior year and 27% more than budget. YTD expenses (HVAC repair, tree pruning, and wall repairs) are 57% less than last year (HVAC repair, carpet runners, A/C unit replacement, sidewalk repairs, and stone repairs) and 52% less than budget.

Year-to-date Mortgage Repayment Fund income is 6% less than prior year and 10% less than budget. YTD payments are 10% less than prior year (due to extra \$10,000 principal payment last year) and 13% more than budget (due to extra \$5,000 principal payment this year). Final payment is scheduled for May 2024. The cash balance includes \$1,340 from the SBA loan for Apr/May interest. When the loan is forgiven, we will recognize this as income.

2021 BENEVOLENCE CALENDAR

January: Compassion International provides educational, health and spiritual guidance to "our" kids: Vanesa, 15, in Mexico, and Simon, 8, in Tanzania. **February**: We'll facilitate **racial justice programming** to bring a better understanding within our congregation and as an outreach to our community.

March: ELC summer youth programming. Through Vacation Bible School, Mission Week and camperships, we'll touch the lives of dozens of kids over break.

April: Divine Savior (Puerto Rico), our sister congregation in Cataño, receives financial assistance for operational needs and to support recovery efforts from Hurricane Maria.

May: Neighbors Helping Neighbors provides free food, clothing, footwear, bedding and access to social services to our neighbors in need.

June: Lutheran Social Services delivers a wide range of programs and services, including adoption, foster care, addiction treatment, senior housing, mental health, and family assistance.

July: Habitat for Humanity empowers people with limited resources to obtain safe, modern housing.

August: Supporting both **LUAD** and **ELCA Disaster Relief** connects us to a local and national / international strategy to help people overcome natural disasters.

September: Through **SABA**, **International**, we aid The Nest Children's Home, New Dawn Orphanage, and Bethel Outreach Children's Center in Kenya.

October: Building Bridges provides a mental health safety net for youth who have sought a residential intervention, coordinating partnerships and collaborations between families, advocates, community and residential service providers, and oversight agencies.

November: Accessible local health care through Our Lady of Hope in Madison and Community Connections Free Clinic in Dodgeville supports people in our region who would otherwise have few or no options for assistance.

December: Madison Area Jail Ministry features 1-on-1 devotion to the spiritual needs of people who are incarcerated and the sheriffs deputies who work at the jail. **2020 DONATION TOTALS** Customarily, we provide a running update of our Benevolence donation totals through the monthly flyers we hand out before presentations at church on the second Sunday of the month.
