## **RETURN TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP BEGINNING APRIL 11TH**

Beginning Sunday, April 11<sup>th</sup>, we will welcome people back into the building for Sunday worship following the guidelines spelled out by the church council. We will proceed carefully as we welcome people back into the building, and reassess our practices as we move forward.

Please note: We ask that you register for worship by Thursday evening if you intend to be there on Sunday morning. You can do this by following the 'Register for Worship' link on the top of the church webpage at [www.elcmthoreb.org](http://www.elcmthoreb.org), or by calling the church office (437-5012). There will be one worship service at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday. Online and phone options will remain in place (see end of article for details), and please do not feel pressured to return if you are not ready to do so. The entire plan is detailed below, please note the extra precautions that will be in place.

### **ELC REOPENING PLAN FOR RETURN TO WORSHIP**

ELC has developed this reopening plan based on best practices, Dane County guidelines, and recommendations from the Wisconsin Council of Churches. We will continue offering online and telephone services. Video and audio feeds are available on the church website, Facebook, and YouTube. A telephone service is available at (855) 514-2017.

- We'll begin with one Sunday service at 10:00am. The service will be abbreviated, roughly thirty minutes long.
- The capacity of the sanctuary is currently limited to county guidelines for indoor gatherings. We don't envision exceeding that in the short-term, but we will stream the service to the fellowship hall if necessary.
- Entry into the building will be limited to the front door and the Agape entrance. At the Agape entrance, use the stairs or elevator. Do not walk through the preschool area.
- Hand sanitizer is available at the entrances.
- We'll track attendance to help with contact tracing in case someone falls ill.

- We'll open as many windows and doors as are feasible, to improve ventilation.
- Masks are required.
- Socially distance from everyone except your family unit.
- Every other pew will be closed off.
- We'll have instrumental music, but no live singing or vocal reciting of liturgy. We will have readers for the lessons.
- We won't pass the offering plate, but you'll be able to leave offerings by the door
- We'll continue to celebrate Holy Communion with individual servings.
- The dismissal will be organized to minimize contact.
- We won't have a fellowship time, and the kitchen will remain closed. No coffee or donuts or drinking fountains.
- The nursery will be open, but we'll remove the toys, books, etc.

Continue to act prudentially. If you're sick or have any of the symptoms of Covid stay away. Be aware of your own personal risk. Stay home if you're uncomfortable with public gatherings. If you find you are diagnosed with Covid-19 please notify the office immediately so contact tracing can be started.

YTD expenses are 6% less than prior year, primarily due to fewer staff hours and savings in various Congregational Life expenses, partially offset by the cost of having an intern this year and increased snow removal expense; YTD expenses are 7% under budget, primarily due to fewer staff hours and savings in utilities and various Congregational Life expenses, partially offset by higher snow removal costs.

# BENEVELONCE

## Helping our Friends in Puerto Rico

The official name of our sister church in Puerto Rico is long and elegant, and rolls off the tongue beautifully: Iglesia Luterano del Divino Salvador. Translated literally, it reads Church Lutheran of the Divine Savior.

The work that Divino Salvador does in this community of roughly 25,000 people across the bay from San Juan is likewise beautiful. One of the few Lutheran churches on the primarily Catholic island, Divino Salvador has a sizable, engaged congregation that provides a support structure for daily life and is a beacon of hope during cataclysmic events such as Hurricane Maria in 2017, a storm so powerful it tore off the roofs off the church and many of its members' houses.

Many ELC members have had the privilege of attending services at Divino Salvador, and have shared stories about the friendliness they encountered -- and the legendary Sunday picnics the congregation hosts on a nearby beach. Our relationship with Divino Salvador stretches back many years, and we've integrated them into the Benevolence schedule since ELC started the program in 2013. We dedicate one month to collecting money for our friends in Puerto Rico and also contribute 10% of Benevolence donations throughout the year.

Traditionally, that money is used for a mix of capital repairs to the facilities and direct aid to people in the congregation, and this past year was no different. Recently, Heriberto Bousquet De La Rosa, president of the Church Council there, reported back to Pastor John the three uses for our annual contribution in 2020:

- \$600 for the purchase of 12 food shopping cards to distribute in aid.
- \$500 for improvements to the Pastoral House.
- \$1,000 for improvements to the Church.

Sr. De La Rosa sends gratitude, along with “a big hug in the love of God.”
