READ: Read the following daily readings to deepen your understanding:

TALK: Consider some of these ideas:

"and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'" -Luke 3:22

In baptism, God claims Jesus Christ in saying, "You are my Son." While most of us do not remember our baptisms, there are similarities between the baptism of Christ and the ones we experience. The Holy Spirit is present, we are washed clean, and claimed by God the Father and the rest of the church.

- **PRAY:** May the Holy Spirit move in us that we may live out our baptism and baptismal promises in our daily life. Remind us that we have been claimed by our God Most High and

remain with us always, in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.
