WELCOMING WORD In holy baptism God makes saints out of sinners. In holy communion God forgives the sins of all the saints. In worship today, we give thanks for all the saints "who from their labors rest." Sealed by the Spirit and sustained by the Savior's body and blood, we live with joy as God gives us breath, to the praise of God's glory.

SECOND READING: Ephesians 1:11-23

¹¹In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹²so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory. 15 have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, ¹⁸so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹ and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. ²⁰God put this power to work in Christ when he

DEVOTIONS FOR THE WEEK OF NOVEMBER 6, 2022

SHARE: What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

READ: Read the following daily readings to deepen your understanding:

Monday, Psalm 123, Prayer for Mercy Tuesday, 2 John 1-13, Truth and Love Wednesday, John 5:19-29, The Authority of the Son Thursday, Psalm 98, Praise for the Judge of the World Friday, 2 Thessalonians 1:3-12, The Judgement of Christ Saturday, Luke 17:20-37, The Coming of the Kingdom

TALK: Consider some of these ideas:

"Do to others as you would have them do to you."

In echoes of the prophet Isaiah and Mary's song of praise, Jesus reveals surprising things about who enjoys blessing and who endures woe. He invites his disciples to shower radical love, blessing, forgiveness, generosity, and trust even on enemies and outsiders

- What saint in your life has had the greatest influence on your faith?
- When have you caught a glimpse of salvation in your life on earth? (Luke 20:36-38)
- Do you feel the power of hope day to day in your life? (Eph 1:18)

PRAY: Holy One, hold us in community with one another. Nurture a spirit of abundant hospitality and intentional inclusion among us, welcoming the gifts of adults and children. Inspire creative visions for our life together. In your name we pray. Amen
