¹See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ²Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed.

- 1 John 3:1-2a

One of the hardest things to hear as a child was 'not yet'. No matter if we were waiting to get to the end of a long car ride, or waiting for Christmas to arrive, it seemed as if we were always on the way, but not there yet. This is also one of the continuing aspects of our faith and life together as a congregation. We are always on the journey, but not there yet.

What's worse is that we don't always have a calendar or road map that can tell us where we are in this journey. Even more, we don't know exactly what it will look like when we get there. This is not unusual in the life of God's people. Israel left Egypt for an uncertain time in the wilderness, setting out for the 'promised land', and yet none of those Israelites had ever seen, nor could imagine what it would be like. Even if some old stories had been told, the changes over the years meant that it would be a very different place. Likewise, when they returned from exile, the location might be the same, but they couldn't go back to the way it once was.

Today I still get asked, when do you think things will go back the way they were? My truthful answer is: they can't, and they never will. And our fascination with our nostalgic memories may keep us from seeing where God is calling now. As John told his readers: "We are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed".

The history of the church teaches this as well. The church of 1600, was a very different church that 100 years before that, and little like it was 300 years later. The task of discipleship is not to ask how can we go back, but what have we learned, and pray "Dear God, what's next?"

We can continue to treasure our memories, and learn from our experiences, but we need to constantly be seeking the wisdom and guidance of God's Spirit, and be watchful for where God is active in our lives and in our world.

I invite each of you to think, imagine, listen, and pray for God's guidance for our life together, and mostly share what you hear, see, and think. God always provides every gift we need to do ministry, but God provides them through many different people and many different gifts. We need to talk, laugh, learn, console, and dream together about what it means to be God's congregation in Mt. Horeb today and for the years to come.

Thank you to all who have supported ministry here with their talents and resources. Especially those who have accepted leadership positions and served faithfully.

Please pray for our congregation and all its people, and share the journey into another new day.

Youth Director Update - Children & Youth Ministry

2022 has been a year that is now looking a bit more 'normal' at ELC. We continue to keep learning about God.

growing in faith and cherishing being together. Highlights of this year:

Sunday School classes for ages 3 years old through 8th grade. Currently we have 23 registered. In January, we had 5 youth attend weekly. Average attendance this fall is now 15. I plan lessons with a Bible story, crafts & games. We begin with our music time in the chapel. Currently have 3 main classes, based on ages. Every 3rd Sunday, we focus on a service opportunity for our young people.

Confirmation meets on Wednesday evenings for 7th and 8th graders, in person. This fall we have 12 -7th graders and 9 -8th graders in our program. We use the Faith Inkubators curriculum for our lessons. We confirmed 19 - 9th graders, on Reformation Sunday (10/30/22). Students have also returned to acolyting during worship.

→Senior Blankets - 15 graduates received their fleece blanket, so they remember ELC when they are away. Thank you to Jody Morey for her donations of the fabric and helping with the organization.

VBS/Day Camp 2022 - Despite Sugar Creek Staff letting me know about 2 weeks ahead of our week of their cancellation, we had a positive week. We had awesome leaders for VBS & Day Camp from our high school age youth. We had 10 children for VBS. Day camp had 9 who signed up, and 7 attended. We used the curriculum that Sugar Creek provided to us, "God's Boundless Love". Besides their games, stories, crafts, they also did some community projects, cleaning up the bike trail, helping at Neighbors Helping Neighbors, decorating pots, planting flowers, making cards and baking cookies. Very positive acts of kindness and love.

GIVE LOVE SERVE (Thriving on Thursdays) -Youth from ELC helped many people with our various service projects throughout the summer. We also appreciate the many donations of food and blankets. This was a great opportunity to care for our neighbors. Our impact this summer ●Raised \$427 - Pflag - Mt Horeb (Car Wash); ● Unload truck for NHN & help sort at Food Closet; ● 25 'Meals in a Bag' for Little Food Pantries; ● 3 Tied Blankets for NHN Giving Tree; ● River Food Pantry; ● Second Harvest Food Bank; ● Planting at Stewart Park ●painting the youth room.

Youthworks Trip - St Louis: June 26, 2022 - July 1, 2022 Sent 8 youth/ 3 adults to St Louis. Always a great opportunity to serve others. Our girls were impacted by various organizations. Urban Reach is one that stays in their hearts. They continue to fundraise for them. Thank you to those who supported their summer brat stand, yard sale and the Parent's Night Out (Nov 4). They have earned \$2579.60 so far. They plan to deliver a check in person.

Youth Gathering 2022 - Unfortunately, the Gathering was canceled for 2022.

Thank you - Many thanks to everyone who helped support our fundraising efforts throughout the year. The experiences are so meaningful in their faith walk.

FUSE (<u>Faith unleashed</u>. <u>Supporting Everyone</u>) – Youth, who are 9th - 12th graders are welcome to join our high school group. We focus on meeting 2 times per month, now on Sundays, so youth can attend with their busy schedules. We have opportunities for fellowship, service and learning together.

Synod Events - Our youth have participated in the 'Emerge' retreat at Bethel Horizons this summer and also attended the 'Alive' night, which 175 youth from the synod attended

Annual Report 2022-2023 School year

Agape Christian Preschool (ACP) is a non-denominational outreach ministry of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Mount Horeb. It is the mission of ACP to provide a Christ-centered, high-quality early childhood education to children ages 3 through 5 (pre-kindergarten) as well as supporting the MHASD Community 4K program.

The 2022-2023 school year has started out well, in our ninth year of separate 4K and 3K classes. The Agape program has been ongoing for the past 32 years, continuing the solid foundation started on May 16, 1990. Our current enrollment in the 3K program has 36 children of the maximum of 40. We are pleased to see the 3K enrollment back up to almost full. There are 30 children enrolled in the 4K program, with room for 6 additional students. We usually see this number increase as the school year continues as families move into our ever-growing community. The Toddler Time Program, held on Friday mornings for 2-year-old children & care givers, is growing strong. We are consistently supporting 6-8 children and families each week. We are so grateful to be able to offer this outreach program to our community. The Toddler Time class is one of the wonderful ways we continue to fill our 3 and 4-year-old classes!

We have an impressive group of children and staff learning and working together. Our classes are facilitated by our remarkable teaching staff – Cathy Fountas, Jenelle Ollendick, Wendy Rasmussen, Katy Seibel, and Anita Symons.

Annual fundraising options are still a work in progress as the board of directors continues to think "outside of the box" for creative and lucrative ways to provide financial support. The annual butter braid fundraiser will take place in early spring, and monthly Scholastic book orders will be offered to all preschool families. The board of directors incorporates these fundraisers to assist in the financial support of curriculum, scholarships, and additional unforeseen expenses to keep enrollment fees at a minimal expense to our families. Our current budget for the 2022-2023 school year is attached.

It is a pleasure to recognize our current board members: Anne Woolard and Lindsey Schulenberg (Cochairs), Brittany Kahl (Treasurer), Jessi Garfoot Sullivan (Secretary), Serena Vondra (Council Liaison), Megan Kelly and Kim Lins. Thank you to all current and former board members for sharing valuable time and dedication to the ACP ministry.

Property Ministry

Annual Report 2021-2022 Major (highlights?) activities:

*Chapel: Replaced all the lights with LED's and painted the walls and cleaned the wooden panels from bottom to top.

*Kitchen: replaced the warped veneer on the pull down from the kitchen to Fellowship Hall.

January - Major leak from kitchen to the Agape bathroom below. Leak from the sink. Pipes replaced and major repairs in the bathroom and under the sink

March – another leak, this one from the dishwasher. Damage again in the Agape bathroom. Problems resolved and damage repaired.

May – another problem with the dishwasher. Discovered the booster heater that sanitizes at the final rinse was not working. Problem was limed up pipes to the heater and a failed part. Replaced the pipes and part. Cooperative effort by A+ Plumbing and Hobart.

*Agape: continuing issues with the automatic door to the outside. Seems to be directly related to the weather (?). Window leak in the SE classroom. Crack alongside the window was caulked and leak repaired.

*Outside: The Yew trees at the main entrance were pruned.

Stone work – corner vent chase the old mortar was removed and re-tucked. Waiting restoration of the front light piers to be completed.

*Insurance - Met with Church Mutual, our property insurance carrier to review and update the areas of coverage. ELC requested a full Risk Assessment of the property. Results of the assessment: "Beautiful property, well maintained". Details have not been received, as the report goes to the underwriters.

*Main office: painted the walls and replaced the carpet. The outer offices will be done October 13-17.

*Basement: continue to see water on the east side. A major rainstorm in July resulted a lot of water – more than usual. Difficult to get at the outside due to the overgrowth of the bushes. All the bushes were taken out during the Sunday work day.

Investigation revealed the issue is with a clogged downspout that goes underground. This is a problem waiting resolution. The drain tile will be capped off and replaced with above ground pipes. Major restoration of the area will be done in the spring.

This storm also knocked out power in the building, especially the sound board. Couldn't live stream the service. Technology team continues to investigate replacement solutions.

*Fellowship Hall: one of the air conditioning units failed. Problem is with the outside compressor which won't be replaced until spring. Three remaining units are working OK.

What's next? Decisions for the Council:

Re-landscape east side under the Sacristy

Paint the pillars in the Sanctuary

Replace the front and chapel entry concrete aprons that are cracked and pulling apart

Replace the disintegrating bike rack with something new

Paint hallways where needed

Paint outside trim especially under the steeple

Paint and refresh the nursery

Determine when time to restart the project to replace the lights in the Sanctuary with LED's and install fans.

Technology

The primary focus of the technology ministry over the past year was as follows:

Sunday Services: Operation of sound equipment and projection screens. This includes assisting in developing the announcement videos and slides on a weekly basis. A significant change made this year was to incorporate more of the service onto the slides. Prior to this year, the projection equipment was primarily used for announcements, special videos, and songs only. We continue to live stream services via Facebook Live, YouTube, and Phonelivestreaming.com platforms.

Maintenance of Computer and Associated Office Equipment: We replaced wireless network access points in the new addition that were at the end of their service life. Provided new network connections for new office printer/copiers in the main office. Procured a "new" used computer for the intern office. Procured a new "used" computer to replace the streaming computer located in the sanctuary.

We encountered a significant setback in July. A power surge significantly damaged equipment, including the sound board, streaming computer, and some miscellaneous equipment for video

distribution. This degraded our capabilities to control audio and stream services. We are in the process of replacing this equipment with new and upgraded equipment. The new sound board having arrived in early October.

We will continue to work at bringing the equipment back to the pre-lightning strike state; however, we still have some work to do. We lost several pieces of equipment including sound, networking and computer related. Although, not as high-priority as the sound board, we lost sanctuary camera hardware that we are still trying to access and address.

We would like to make a special thank you to those who have contributed to help fund the technology ministry this past year.

We would also like to make a special call out to Chris Underwood for loaning his sound equipment while we were trying to access and plan how to move forward. We are so blessed for the Underwood's generosity and sacrifice that was made. We were able to get the sound booth up and running in a short period of time and truly understand and access our best options before proceeding.

In the coming year our focus will be on the following areas:

- 1. Continue to improve on our ability to livestream services and incorporating the new equipment.
- 2. Replace wireless access equipment that has reached the end of life in the remainder of the church.
- 3. Complete security camera installation project interrupted by the pandemic.
- 4. Grow the technology team

The technology team currently consists of Andy Mullendore, Bruce Meister, John Coffin, and Ryan Bredeson. We would love to add more people to the team and no technical background is required. Please contact Andy or Bruce (or leave a note at the church office) if you would like to assist in anyway.

Making quilts takes contributions of time and materials from the congregation. Often there are bags of donations in front of the quilting room door (just across the hall from the church kitchen). You can recognize the door by the quilt square displayed in the window. Sheets, blankets, mattress pads, curtains, and yard goods make up most of the quilts. Thank you all for your generosity.

Quilt work begins every Thursday, except Thanksgiving, at 9:00 a.m. in Fellowship Hall. Prepared pieces are stretched and clamped to a pair of tables to be tied together, pinned, and sent to the sewing machine for hemming. If you can tie your shoes, you can tie a quilt. Consider stopping by to see how it works and give it a try.

164 quilts were shipped to Lutheran World Relief

3 small quilts were given to infants at baptism

3 special quilts were finished as a gift to the Rinabargers

1 quilt was sent to Sugar Creek for fundraising

1 quilt was given to Paige and Intern Joseph as wedding gift
