#### A Note from PASTOR JOHN

#### **Lenten Journey 2023**

We often talk about the season of Lent as a journey moving toward the victory at Easter. However, as long as we walk this earth our journeys are not complete. Perhaps we have felt God's call to speak out, act, lead, or participate, but have tried to put it off, or taken a different path. We learn in Jonah's story that God continues to remain with us, call us, and redirect our lives. We all have unfinished business.

That's our theme for Lent this year: "Unfinished" We will follow the journey of Jonah from week to week for our Wednesday worship gatherings.

Jonah walks a Lenten path. Like all human beings, he is prone to wander from his Creator in favor of determining the shape and scope of his own future. This temptation is especially powerful when God calls us to take on risky ventures, travel to strange places, and confront things inside of us that prevent us from seeing one another as God does. God meets us in those challenging, Lent-like spaces when we find ourselves somewhere between trust and doubt, courage and fear, anger and empathy.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

#### December 2022

We closed the year strongly, with an operational surplus for the month of December. For the year operating income was 84% of budget and expenses were 97% of budget, resulting in a deficit of \$52,137. Our cash balance at year-end was \$138,766.

Designated fund income last month included \$17,510 from Rose Klir's estate, bringing her total gift to almost \$65,000. Additional designated giving included \$500 for the kitchen, \$325 for music, \$228 for youth, \$130 for internship, \$125 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors, \$3 for Sunday School, and \$84 unspecified. Expenses included \$140 from the internship fund for rental utilities, and \$125 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors.

Building fund expenses last month included \$820 for downspout extensions and \$1292 for office renovation.

As we close the books on 2022, it seems appropriate to emphasize how valuable your generosity is in allowing the church to serve God and our neighbors both now and in the future. Of special note this year, we raised over \$10,000 for Ukraine via Lutheran World Relief, and our Benevolence program raised over \$12,000 for a wide range of charitable causes. Thank you!

2023 looks to be another exciting year, as we continue with our internship program and retire the mortgage.

Ever since we started the Benevolence Program, we've supported a pair of kids from different countries through Compassion International. This program provides them support in many aspects of their life that they wouldn't receive otherwise – everything from academic tutoring to health screening to field trips, and of course spiritual guidance. We've been able to maintain connections with kids for several years at a time before they either move to other communities or age out of the program. Jen Mullendore, who was an advocate for starting our work with Compassion, has faithfully managed our relationship with these kids

for more than a decade, exchanging letters several times through the course of a year. Let me share a little bit about the two kids we support now through your contributions:

- Ariana is a 5-year-old who lives in Mexico with her mother. We've been sponsoring her for two years. Arianna loves art, drawing, playing games, playing house, learning about God and snacking! She helps her family by taking care of animals, cleaning, and making beds. Her favorite school subject is art. Ariana's birthday is March 11.
- Simon is a 10-year-old who lives in Tanzania with his mother. We have been sponsoring him for five years now! Simon loves playing with friends and being active in a variety of ways. He likes playing just about any sport involving a ball getting bounced, kicked, or thrown; participates in service projects; and helps his family by cleaning, buying or selling at the market, and gathering firewood. #### RECONCILING IN CHRIST

Learning with Pastor Javen to "Walk the Talk of Welcome"

Of the many Bible passages that inspire the Rev. Javen Swanson, he cited one during his visit to ELC that particularly resonates with him on a personal level: "I come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly."

That's a message from Jesus captured in John 10:10, where he promises believers a life far better than we could ever imagine – one that is meaningful, purposeful, joyful, eternal.

"For me," Pastor Javen said, "I was not able to start living abundantly until I came out."

That moment didn't come until years after he was a Confirmation student at Pastor John Twiton's church in rural Minnesota, when Pastor Javen surrendered the illusion that he could put on a public face as a straight guy. Those two formed a connection a quarter century ago that endures today, and led to Pastor Javen accepting an invitation to make a day-long visit to ELC on Jan. 21 to help us "Walk the Talk of Welcome."

During a series of discussions – including a sermon at our service, a chat over coffee with members of the congregation and community, and a discussion with our youth group – Pastor Javen (pronounced JAY-ven) brought forth his experiences as a gay man who accomplished his dream of becoming a minister, and led discussions about how we can better fulfill our pledge as a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) congregation.

That RIC pledge asks us to actively welcome everyone in the community – regardless of race, ethnicity, gender expression, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, faith traditions, physical or mental abilities, financial resources, family status, or personal struggles.

Pastor Javen serves as Associate Pastor at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Saint Paul, Minn., which became a RIC congregation in 1999. For everything his church has done to become more welcoming to people from all walks of life, he reminded us to think of RIC as an ongoing journey, rather than a trip that ends at a defined destination: "It's always a work in progress."

#### **RECONCILING IN CHRIST cont.**

For all the strides we've made as a denomination and as a church to forge official positions in favor of the LGBTQ+ community, we need to continue adopting steps that live into that welcoming stance and to build relationships with people whom society has pushed to the margins.

Our discussions covered a lot of ground. Some takeaways included:

- Follow your curiosity. Don't let your fear about saying or doing something wrong interfere with your desire to introduce yourself and start a conversation with someone you don't know.
- Words matter. Think about reframing traditional small talk to be more inclusive and universal. Instead of asking about someone's husband or wife, ask about their family. Instead of asking about their work, ask about their interests.
- Facilitate human interactions. Many people don't regularly cross paths with those who are different from them, which creates a disconnect and enables assumptions to form. Create situations where people from underrepresented groups can be heard, to broaden your and others' horizons. "When we get to know someone's story, it becomes harder to dislike them," Pastor Javen said.
- Show our support. Displaying a Pride flag outside our door signals acceptance. We also need to venture outward with our support, which could mean marching with PFLAG in the

- Summer Frolic parade or taking part in anti-racist conversations and demonstrations in the community.
- Update our physical environment. "Sometimes when I walk into a church, I feel like I'm walking back into the '60s," Pastor Javen said. How can we change that to make the church seem as "with it" as other places where people go? Some suggestions: Getting new signs for our bathrooms to put the focus on the plumbing fixtures inside rather than classifying access by gender. Update our library to include books and other resources that feature a diverse set of

- characters. Look at our paintings and art to see if we're featuring whitewashed adaptations of Jesus and other people and stories from the Bible.
- Listen to the spirit of the Bible. A handful of passages have been used through the years to denounce homosexuality. It's tempting to retort by citing other references that we've collectively dismissed as culturally outdated such as dietary prohibitions or women needing to wear veils but Pastor Javen believes that approach doesn't end well because it undermines the Bible's credibility. Instead, he urges us to view the Bible through a different lens: as a series of lessons that point us toward love. "Luther said the Bible is the manger that holds Christ," he said. "We don't worship the Bible, we worship the Jesus revealed to us in the Bible."

Thank you to Pastor Javen for making the journey to Mount Horeb from the Twin Cities, to Pastor John and the RIC committee for organizing this event, to Diane Dangerfield and the Praise Team for selecting music that brought to life the "welcome" theme, and to the congregation for covering Pastor Javen's expenses through Benevolence Program donations to RIC.

2 swaddling blankets 36" to 52" square

4 cloth diapers, flat fold preferred

1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap

2 pairs of socks

1 hand towel, dark color recommended

2 or 3 bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand,

2 diaper pins or large safety pins

Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) can be substituted for new ones.

Sizes 6 to 24 months may be used.




