WELCOMING WORD All Saints celebrates the baptized people of God, living and dead, who are the body of Christ. As November heralds the dying of the landscape in many northern regions, the readings and liturgy call us to remember all who have died in Christ and whose baptism is complete. At the Lord's table we gather with the faithful of every time and place, trusting that the promises of God will be fulfilled and that all tears will be wiped away in the new Jerusalem.

FIRST READING: Revelation 7:9-17

⁹After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" ¹¹And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹²singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! READ: Read the following daily readings to deepen your understanding:

Monday, Psalm 5, Trust in God for Deliverance Tuesday, Lamentations 2:13-17, God's Warnings Fulfilled Wednesday, Proverbs 16:21-23, Wisdom and Speech Thursday, Psalm 70, Prayer for Deliverance Friday, Amos 3:1-12, Israel's Guilt and Punishment Saturday, Matthew 24:1-14, Signs of the End of the Age

TALK: Consider some of these ideas:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." -- Matthew 5:3

In the Beatitudes, Jesus provides a unique description of those who are blessed with God's favor. His teaching is surprising and shocking to those who seek wealth, fame, and control over others.

- How are the Beatitudes an act of protest against the current order of any time and place? Matt 5:1-2
- All saints have faults and limitations, so where does our "sainthood" originate? Rev 7:9-17
- What do you know from the testimony of your congregation's saints/ancestors about their identity as children of God? 1 Jn 3:1

PRAY: Holy One, hold us in community with one another. Nurture a spirit of abundant hospitality and intentional inclusion among us, welcoming the gifts of adults and children. Inspire creative visions for our life together. In your name we pray. Amen
