A Note from PASTOR JOHN Making a Way Out of No Way - Lent 2024

This year's Lenten resource uses "Making a Way Out of No Way" as a guiding theme. The opening litany borrows from Isaiah 43:19 "I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." The stories for each week all find a thread of God making a way where no way seems to be, whether because it feels hopeless or because the person God chose tries to run away or because we feel we have nothing to offer."

Ash Wednesday - February 14th - Genesis 11:27-12:1

"God will make a way even when the way isn't obvious."

February 21st - Jonah 1:1-3 and Jonah 3:1-4

"God will make a way even when we try to run away"

February 28th - Exodus 14:10-14, 19-22

"God will make a way even when the odds feel stacked against us"

March 6th - 1 Kings 17:8-16

"God will make a way when we feel like we have little to offer"

March 13th - Acts 16:6-15

"God is making a way even when the way doesn't seem clear"

I found these themes very appropriate for this year as we try to understand what God is calling us to do and to be in this society. It is far too easy to resign ourselves to just getting by and forgetting that God has led God's people through many unsettled and difficult times. We follow a living Christ who will continue to make a way for ELC and for each of us!

For me, winter stops being fun about a week into the New Year. By the time the Christmas decorations are taken down, the spirit of the holidays has left and the novelty of snow has faded into the dirty slush that currently coats our roads. If winter was just Christmas and New Year's, it would be my favorite season. I love a little snow, I love the peppermint, and I love the lights. What I don't love, however, is the feeling that lingers after it all fades.

I had the sacred honor to help officiate over two funerals last month, as well as making a home visit for another death, and these events, too, linger in my heart. We're in the bitter cold of winter, and what better thing to accompany death than that? It's a somber feeling, but for us Christians, we are called to live a life knowing that death may take us, but it will not succeed over us. Imagine my surprise when I looked at the calendar and saw that Ash Wednesday was already around the corner!

Ash Wednesday is God's reminder that we all will return to dust, but this is not a permanent death. Much like we know that Spring will come, we can rest comfortably knowing that Christ will succeed on Easter morning, shattering death's hold over us and raising us into new life. For we Christians, death is just another part of life. It is a comma, rather than a period. And, even more importantly, it is a reminder that Christ keeps us warm, even in these dreary late winter months. Amen.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Prepared January 6, 2024

We saw generous giving in December of \$44,711, in addition to \$5,000 that was transferred from the unspecified designated fund early in the month. The general-fund balance of \$9,486 includes \$17,445 in assets and \$7,958 in outstanding liabilities. The monthly surplus of \$16,745 narrowed our 2023 general-fund deficit to \$8,718. That's a substantial improvement over our \$46,182 loss from 2022. Our overall balance sheet showed \$129,049 at the end of 2023, a slight decrease from the \$138,766 we had at the end of 2022.

December expenses from the designated funds include \$1,499 for the internship program and \$1,150 for our youth programs. Designated income included \$1,000 for camperships, \$360 for music, \$313 for youth, \$50 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors, \$25 for the altar guild, \$20 for internship, and \$589 unspecified. The \$5,000 transfer to the general fund is reported on our cash-flow statement as negative designated-fund income.



We've been able to maintain connections with kids for several years at a time before they either move to other communities or age out of the program. Jen Mullendore, who was an advocate for starting our work with Compassion, has faithfully managed our relationship with these kids for more than a decade, exchanging letters several times through the course of a year.

Let me share a little bit about the two children we support now through your contributions:

- Ariana is a 6-year-old who lives in Mexico with her mother. We've been sponsoring her for three years. Arianna loves art, drawing, playing games, playing house, learning about God and snacking! She helps her family by taking care of animals, cleaning, and making beds. Her favorite school subject is art. Ariana's birthday is March 11.
- Simon is an 11-year-old who lives in Tanzania with his mother. We have been sponsoring him for six years now! Simon loves playing with friends and being active in a variety of ways. He likes playing just about any sport involving a ball getting bounced, kicked, or thrown; participates in service projects; and helps his family by cleaning, buying or selling at the market, and gathering firewood. His favorite school subjects are math and reading. Simon's birthday is March 25.




