A Note from PASTOR JOHN

"Foolishness"

A few weeks ago, we read this verse from Paul's letter to the Corinthians: "The message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18).

This verse still speaks a strong word today. As we move toward the great celebration of the resurrection on Easter day at the end of this month, it is striking that much of our society still cannot grasp the hope of life that can sustain us regardless of our circumstances and earthly accomplishments. The Easter hope, that the power of God is stronger than anything in the world, seems absurd to them. We live each day in the hope, the glory of Easter, because to us it is life itself.

The world does not seem to know what to do with this message. Christmas has largely been co-opted by shopping and giving mania that overtakes the season. And, after all, who can resist the stories of shepherds, angels, friendly beasts, and the babe in the manger.

But the days leading up to Easter, with the betrayal of Jesus, the denial of the disciples, the blood-thirsty crowd, and the viciousness of crucifixion, seems all too real even in today's world. We see and hear of such cruelties nearly every day, and they seem to be unending, and unstoppable. Yet we declare with all our voices that the pain, cruelty, and ways of death cannot have the final word.

Moreover, they are defeated not by a powerful army, or a strike of lightning from on high, but are defeated by the power of God's love in Jesus. That love which is willing to give its all for us, for the ones God loves. So, let's engage in the foolishness which sings songs in graveyards, which proclaims that love is stronger than hate, life is stronger that death, and joy will always be God's last word!

TREASURER'S REPORT

We received several very generous individual donations in January, over and above the usual baseline. These gifts have restored a margin of safety to the general fund. At the end of the month, we had \$32,472 in assets against \$1,592 in liabilities for a balance of \$30,879. And although it's not reflected in the January totals, an additional \$5,000 gift in February will be used for a much-needed renovation of the lighting in the sanctuary. Thank you to everyone who's helped steady the ship.

January expenses from the designated funds include \$1,381 for the internship program, \$1008 for music, and \$334 for landscaping. Designated include includes \$4312 for youth, \$300 for the kitchen, \$35 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors, \$20 each for Sunday school and the internship program, and \$103 unspecified.


