

A Note from PASTOR JOHN Easter - A New Song

O sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things.

His right hand and his holy arm have gained him victory.

The LORD has made known his victory; he has revealed his vindication in the sight of the nations.

He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel.

All the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God.

-Psalm 98

With the celebration of Jesus' victory at Easter, we are given the mission of bring the new song of God's victory to the world! God has done the most marvelous thing imaginable! The church is always at its most daring and risking and dangerous and free when it sings a new song. Because then it sings that the power of the gospel will not let the world finally stay as it is."

Let's commit ourselves to the joyful task of proclaiming the good news of a new way of life, and the power of God's love to change our present and our future. Let's move together forward into God's new day of victory!!

Please help the Church Directory committee by signing up as soon as possible for your directory picture. For those members that haven't signed up by April 10th the committee will call to get you scheduled. If you are not having your picture taken, we still need your updated information for our church records. Please email Dave at abaumgartner1@charter.net or call Dave at 608-576-8798 and let him know by 4/10/2024 that you are not having your picture taken. At that time, provide him with your current contact information, i.e. current address, contact phone numbers and email address. We need the correct information for our church records and the directory being published. (Email addresses will only be used for church records, they will not be published in the directory.)

Currently there are 138 time slots available for our church directory pictures and we currently have over 270 family units in our congregation. Once we have 80% of the 138 time slots scheduled by members, Universal Church Directories will provide more time slots to accommodate our needs

May 1st thru 4th are the dates pictures will be taken for the directory at this time. To sign up:

- 1. Go to www.ucdir.com
- 2. Click on the box that says "photography appointment scheduling login"
- 3. Then enter church code wi325 and password photos then press enter.
- 4. Then you can pick the day and time you want to have your picture taken. The available dates will show. Enter the required information.
- 5. Click the Schedule Appointment button at the bottom of the screen to reserve the photography appointment time in your family name.
- 6. Print the next screen to use as a reminder of your appointment.

Note: If you have more than six family members or are having a pet in your picture schedule two consecutive appointment times.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Giving in February was close to expectations, but facility costs were high, due to snow removal (those snow storms seem like a distant memory) and quarterly office expenses. As a result, the general fund deficit for February was \$13,338. At the end of the month we had \$20,367 in assets against \$2,856 in outstanding liabilities, for a balance of \$17,541. We also received a large undesignated gift of \$5,000, which will be used to for lighting and painting in the sanctuary.

February expenses from the designated funds include \$3,225 for a new refrigerator, \$897 for youth, \$457 for the internship program, and \$60 for technology. Designated-fund income included \$1,900 in memorials for Dawn Kellesvig, \$450 for the kitchen, \$290 for music, \$230 for the internship program, \$187 for youth, \$50 for landscaping, \$20 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors, \$10 for Sunday school, and \$89 unspecified.

RIC opens doors - to invite others in, and to venture out

Is it enough just to open our doors to everyone? Or are we bold and courageous enough to take that next step and not just invite people in, but venture out?

The Reconciliation in Christ (RIC) Committee has challenged itself – and our congregation – to live into the biblical calling to not just make ELC a welcoming place, but to show that we want to make a positive impact in the world around us. Especially among people who've either been excluded or not regularly present at our services.

Last year, RIC created opportunities for ELC members to hear the perspective of Rev. Javen Swanson, a gay man who fulfilled his dream of serving in the Lutheran clergy; participated in and provided dinner at the PFLAG march to show support for LGBTQ+ members of our community; visited Centro Hispano's market night in Madison; and attended graduation ceremonies hosted by the Latino Academy of Workforce Development.

Already in 2024, RIC organized a field trip of sorts to Christ the Solid Rock Baptist Church in Madison to converse with and experience the dynamic preaching of Rev. Everett Mitchell in a truly multicultural congregation. And plans are in the works to again support PFLAG's annual march through Mount Horeb – to show solidarity with and support for members of that group through our presence, and through Carl Sieg's "well-done" work on the grill.

The Committee's work is guided by ELC's welcome statement, striving to open our hearts, minds, and congregation to those who have not always felt they had a voice or a place in the church. Contributions to RIC go to two places:

- Creating these opportunities to engage with the broader community and invite others in
- **Supporting** the national RIC organization, which inspires ELC and churches around the country to be the change they want to see in the world.
