

PRELUDE Diane Dangerfield

You are encouraged to use the time during the Prelude for quiet reflection and preparing for worship.

WELCOMING WORD When we say God is the triune God, we are saying something about who God is beyond, before, and after the universe: that there is community within God. Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to his Abba (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the one who sent him.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

L - Blessed be the holy Trinity, one God, who forgives all our sin, whose mercy endures forever.

C - Amen.

L - God of all mercy and consolation, come to the help of your people, turning us from our sin to live for you alone. Give us the power of your Holy Spirit that we may confess our sin, receive your forgiveness, and grow into the fullness of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

(Silence is kept for reflection.)

L - In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for his sake God forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

FIRST READING - Psalm 29 (read responsively)

- ¹ Ascribe to the Lord, O heavenly beings, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.
- ² Ascribe to the Lord the glory of his name; worship the Lord in holy splendor.
- ³ The voice of the Lord is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, the Lord, over mighty waters.
- ⁴ The voice of the Lord is powerful; the voice of the Lord is full of majesty.
- ⁵ The voice of the Lord breaks the cedars; the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon.
- ⁶He makes Lebanon skip like a calf and Mount Hermon like a young wild ox.
- ⁷ The voice of the Lord flashes forth flames of fire.
- ⁸ The voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness; the Lord shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.

SECOND READING: Romans 8:12-17

¹²Brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—¹³for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" ¹⁶it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

GOSPEL: John 3:1-17

 1 Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. 2 He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God: for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." ³Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered. "Very truly. I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. 6What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' 8The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So, it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." 9Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" 10 Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? 11"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe; how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. ¹⁶"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. 17" Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

SHARE: What was a high point of your day? What was a low point? **READ:** Read the daily readings to deepen your understanding:

Tuesday, 1 Corinthians 2:1-10, Proclaiming Christ Crucified
Wednesday, Numbers 6:22-27, The Priestly Benediction
Thursday, Psalm 81:1-10, God's Appeal to Stubborn Israel

Saturday, Leviticus 24:5-9,

TALK: Consider some of these ideas:

"Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit." – John 3:5

Jesus' miracles prompt Nicodemus to visit him in secrecy. Jesus tells him about being born of the Spirit and about the Son who has been sent by God to save.

- Isaiah believes his unworthiness is also communal. How might his purification affect the community? (Isa 6:1-8)
- How should we put to death bodily deeds while upholding the honor of being an heir of God? (Rom 8:12-17)
- Luther said John 3:16 is the gospel in miniature. What could you add to complete its message?
