# **PASTOR JOHN**

#### "For All the Saints"

November worship always begins with "All Saints' Sunday", a celebration that I look forward to with both anticipation and regret.

I love taking this time to remember the witnesses of faith that have gone before us. It is powerful to see people's faces as they light candles and gather around the altar, where we proclaim that we gather not just with those in the pews, but with angels, and archangels and all the company of heaven.

I am also taken aback by the very real feeling of loss as the list of saints that have impacted my life grows longer each year. But the day is more than a remembrance. It is also a day of proclamation!

For we proclaim that death's power is only temporary. We sing the vision more often than we sometimes realize, but especially that day we proclaim in our hymn, "For All the Saints", a vision of a transformation from death to life. Listen again:



We've raised \$18,000 for the building capital fund and the new roof, and we've received commitments for an additional \$25,000. We need about \$75,000 in the building capital fund, so we're about 57% of the way there. Getting a new roof will be our big project for 2025.

The general fund stabilized somewhat in September. A surplus of \$3,117 raised the general fund balance up to -\$2,009. We were able to cover that debt by timing our payments at the end of the month. We had \$6,409 in the bank, \$6,911 in outstanding checks, \$1,807 in outstanding payroll tax liability, and \$300 in petty cash.

Designated fund expenses last month included \$1,000 to the school district, and \$36 for the kitchen. Income included \$211 for youth, \$50 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors, and \$48 unspecified.

## Ensuring health care is accessible for all

Even for those of us fortunate enough to have quality health insurance, the cost of your premiums, deductibles and co-pays can take a real bite out of your budget. And you've likely looked closely enough at a bill from a clinic visit or procedure to have your eyes opened to the out-of-pocket cost for those services if you're the 1 in 9 state residents without insurance.

Many people in both camps find it difficult or impossible to come up with the money for proper care for acute incidents and persistent illnesses or conditions, which leads them to bypass that care – which, in turn, snowballs into debilitating or even life-threatening conditions.

Fortunately, places like Our Lady of Hope Clinic in Middleton and Community Connections Free Clinic in Dodgeville have recognized this issue and provide solutions. Both are nonprofit clinics that offer medical visits to the uninsured for little or no cost.

We've featured these organizations regularly through Benevolence the past few years, and will do so again in November. Through our donations, we can help people avoid difficult decisions about where to spend their limited discretionary funds – on everyday expenses like gas and food, or the most precious thing of all: their health.

Our Lady of Hope is a Catholic nonprofit clinic that has served the community for 15 years. The clinic is able to provide care for those in financial need thanks to donations and a membership model where clients with means pay a monthly fee for access to quality, personal primary care. More than 55% of visits are made by patients without insurance, oftentimes working full-time jobs that don't provide coverage.

Community Connections' mission is to provide basic health care to those who cannot afford or access medical services in lowa County and surrounding areas. CCFC aims to eliminate obstacles to health care one patient at a time. There is no charge to see providers, and prescription medications are provided at little or no cost as needed. Since its inception in 2006, the clinic has served nearly 3,000 individuals and provided just shy of 15,000 office visits. The average annual prescription savings per patient is estimated at \$4,400. Their work is accomplished by 127 medical and lay

volunteers and two part-time staff people, and is supported generously by donations from local individuals, churches, businesses and organizations, as well as grants and fundraising events.

There are a few ways to support these organizations:
