Fundraising for the new roof is going well. We've increased the building capital fund to \$16,000, and we've received commitments for an additional \$25,000. We need about \$75,000 in the building capital fund, so we're about 55% of the way there. We'd like to hit our goal by the annual meeting.

# TREASURER'S REPORT Cont.

But the general fund is in bad shape. After losing \$8,761 in July, we lost another \$8,148 in August. The cash flow statement includes \$5,000 transferred from the designated fund. We also needed to make transfers in May (\$3,500) and June (\$2,500), meaning that our adjusted general fund income for the year is \$11,000 less than the reported cash flow. The adjusted numbers are shown in the Budget Tracking chart.

At the end of the month, the general fund had \$300 in cash, \$3,191 in the bank, and \$70 pending in flex-system reimbursements, against \$7,091 in outstanding checks and \$1,596 in outstanding tax liabilities, resulting in the reported balance of -\$5,127.

In addition to the \$5,000 transferred to the general fund, designated fund expenses in August included \$195 for camperships, \$58 for the kitchen, and \$110 in petty cash. Income included \$187 for youth, \$100 for praise worship, \$90 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors, \$20 for the internship program, \$20 for music, and \$163 unspecified.

# Jail Ministry continues to expand its mission and impact

The Madison Area Jail Ministry has been providing spiritual and emotional support at the Dane County Jail for more than 50 years – and our area's Lutheran churches have been among its strongest and most loyal supporters.

We at ELC have provided funding for the Jail Ministry for the majority of that time, and throughout all 12 years of the Benevolence Program. We've seen MAJM continue to evolve and expand its focus and support.

The No. 1 focus is the men and women who are incarcerated there – people who are brothers, sisters, fathers, mothers, children, spouses. When the Jail Ministry began in the late 1960s, roughly 100 people were housed in the jail. Today, two chaplains and a group of volunteers addresses the needs of more than 650 people.

And more than just one person is affected when someone goes to jail.

In most cases, the family and friends of someone who is incarcerated is doing time in their own way - dealing with the fallout emotionally, spiritually, financially. MAJM offers support and encouragement to families and often serves as the connection point with those who are behind bars.

Then there are the deputies and jail staff, whose stress is compounded by staffing shortages and trauma exposure. MAJM helps them build a sense of resilience, find meaning in their work and the peace of mind to focus on the well-being of those in jail.

In recent years, MAJM has increased its support network for military veterans who find themselves in jail. And recently, MAJM initiated a program called New Beginnings, which aims to stop the cycle of recidivism by providing people who've recently been released from jail with a consistent structure of accountability, encouragement and spiritual support.

There are many ways to support MAJM, which is the October mission for Benevolence. Here's what you can do:

**Tutor:** Are you passionate about a particular school subject and interested in educating someone interested in helping someone learn so they can better themselves? If so, you can provide one-on-one tutoring for the men and women in the Dane County Jail. To learn more about the program, email info@madisonjailministry.org.

# **BENEVOLENCE Cont.**

**Mentor:** Research shows that community support during the first 6 months after individuals are released from jail or prison is critical to their success. You could start a New Beginnings Team, a group of volunteers who provide emotional and spiritual support to formerly incarcerated individuals during weekly meetings.

**Connect:** To learn more about MAJM, visit their website (madisonjailministry.org) and sign up for their newsletter, and "like" their Facebook page.

**Pray:** Support this "ministry of presence" by praying for Chaplain Todd, the men and women who are incarcerated, and the men and women responsible for their safety.


