A Season of Promise

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah.

Jeremiah 33:14

Our Advent season this year begins with the words of the prophet Jeremiah, speaking of a day when the promise to Israel will come to be fulfilled. Jeremiah's people had endured many dark days, and longed for assurance that God would again act to bring the hope of a new future for God's people.

Thank you to everyone whose gifts, monetary and otherwise, help us worship and serve God here at ELC. We are all stewards of a great many blessings, and it's gratifying to see how many people use those gifts for the glory of God.

At this month's annual meeting the congregation approved the 2025 budget. The full version is available in the annual report, and a summary is listed below.

We also voted to authorize spending of up to \$75,000 from the building capital fund, for a new roof, new hot water boiler, and for water mitigation in the basement. We've raised \$21,568 for the building capital fund, and we've received commitments for an additional \$25,000. We're about 62% of the way there.

Designated fund expenses last month included \$295 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors, and \$198 for music. Income included \$300 for the kitchen, \$187 for youth, and \$102 unspecified.

How YAGM showed me life in Senegal as 'Daba'

This article is written by ELCA member Cecilia Hook, who will share more about her experience abroad during services on Dec. 14-15 and informally at our coffee hour after Sunday's service.

For years prior to my time in Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM), people were telling me about how the program seemed like a good fit for me. And for a long time, I wasn't sure about that. Yet, in 2022, after my final year working at Sugar Creek Bible Camp, I was trying to figure out what was next for me.

As I applied for jobs and looked into different programs around the world, YAGM came to mind. Still skeptical, I decided to look into it. Young Adults in Global Mission is an ELCA-run exchange and volunteer program for young adults ages 21-35. Although I had heard so many good things about the program over the years, I was surprised by and impressed with the model of accompaniment YAGM follows. This model seemed to fit how I wanted to show up in the world. It focuses on walking alongside, listening, and learning from the ELCA's global companions.

After going through the recruitment and application process, I found myself heading to Senegal as one of six in the 2023-2024 YAGM-Sengal Cohort. We spent September together learning about Senegal, practicing languages new to us, and finding community within our cohort. Then, we made our way into our new Senegalese families, communities, and volunteer placements. We were even given new Senegalese names as we were welcomed into these communities. I was now not Cecilia or Ceci but Daba, meaning Wednesday in the Serere language.

It was a lot of new things, fast – a big challenge, but one that I am so glad I had the opportunity to face. I was welcomed despite my language barrier. From the most amazing host family someone could ask for, to the women at the market who helped me practice my tongue at speaking Serere, to my work family, my language tutor, and every one of my neighbors, I was met with beautiful hospitality and community. I learned to challenge myself and be open to the world in new ways. I also learned about how to accept and share community, care, and hospitality in ways I never had experienced before.

YAGM, yes, is a global exchange volunteer program. In my volunteer placement, I got to work alongside Senegalese people as they worked to strengthen the local languages, and I got to learn about community-run preschools. This was amazing work I witnessed and played a small part in.

However, what Young Adults in Global Mission is truly about is creating community and understanding across cultures, across the globe. For that, I am truly grateful.

PROPERTY

Unbeknown to many of our members, there was a massive heating system failure Friday October 18. It turned out to be a very warm weekend and following week, so the building stayed fairly warm.

A technician from Alpha Systems has been on site the past four weeks checking, repairing, checking, repairing...... The system is heating, but a few more fixes are still waiting.

One of the problems he found is the METAL air filters in the two air handling units (one for the chapel, and one for the sanctuary) accumulated *decades* of dust and dirt! He recommended replacing the existing metal filters with modern filters that can be easily replaced on a scheduled basis.

Saturday November 16 a fantastic group of helpers tackled the replacement of 16 filters in the sanctuary unit and 4 in the chapel unit. John and Brenda Martin, John Rosenbaum, Ken Sinner and Conrad Richer braved the tunnel area to facilitate the replacement in the sanctuary unit. They discovered that the fixtures for the chapel unit were slightly larger and wouldn't hold the modern filters. The decision was made to attempt to clean the metal ones until other adjustments could be made. The two John persons took care of the cleaning. The 16 metal filters were taken to the recycle area behind Immanuel Church.

Sincere thanks for their aggressive work which will give cleaner air in the building and reduce the pressure on the entire heating system.

There are a couple of remaining items that will be addressed in the near future.

And a document to identify what maintenance needs to be done on a regular basis is being developed


