FIRST READING - Genesis 45:3-11, 15

³ Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph. Is my father still alive?" But his brothers could not answer him, so dismayed were they at his presence. ⁴ Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come closer to me." And they came closer. He said, "I am your brother, Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt. ⁵ And now do not be distressed, or angry with yourselves, because you sold me here; for God sent me before you to preserve life.⁶ For the famine has been in the land these two years: and there are five more years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvest. ⁷ God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant on earth, and to keep alive for you many survivors.⁸ So it was not vou who sent me here, but God: he has made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house and ruler over all the land of Egypt. ⁹ Hurry and go up to my father and say to him, 'Thus says your son Joseph. God has made me lord of all Egypt: come down to me, do not delay. ¹⁰ You shall settle in the land of Goshen, and you shall be near me, you and your children and your children's children, as well as your flocks, your herds, and all that you have. ¹¹ I will provide for you there—since there are five more years of famine to come—so that you and your household, and all that you have, will not come to poverty.' "¹⁵ And he kissed all his brothers and wept upon them: and after that his brothers talked with him.

SECOND READING: Psalm 37:1-11, 39-40 (read responsively)

¹ Do not be provoked by evildoers; do not be jealous of those who do wrong.

² For they shall soon wither like the grass, and like the green grass fade away.

³ Put your trust in the LORD and do good; dwell in the land and find safe pasture.

 4 Take delight $^{|}$ in the LORD, who shall give you your heart's desire.

⁵ Commit your way to the LORD; put your trust in the LORD, and see what God will do.

⁶ The LORD will make your vindication as clear as the light and the justice of your case like the noonday sun.

⁷ Be still before the LORD and wait patiently. Do not be provoked by the one who prospers, the one who succeeds in evil schemes.

Refrain from anger, leave rage alone; do not be provoked; it leads only to evil.

⁹ For evildoers shall be cut off, but those who hope in the LORD shall possess the land.

¹⁰ In a little while the wicked shall be no more; even if you search out their place, they will not be there.

¹¹ But the lowly shall possess the land; they will delight in abundance of peace.

GOSPEL: Luke 6:27-38

[Jesus said:] ²⁷ "But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸ bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you.²⁹ If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. ³⁰ Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. ³¹ Do to others as you would have them do to you. ³² "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. ³³ If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. ³⁴ If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. ³⁵ But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. ³⁶ Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. ³⁷ "Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; ³⁸ give, and it will be given to you. SHARE: What was a high point of your day? What was a low point? READ: Read the daily readings to deepen your understanding: Monday, Psalm 38, Plea for Healing Tuesday, 1 Corinthians 11:17-22, 27-33, The Lord's Supper Wednesday, Luke 17:1-4, Sayings of Jesus Thursday, Psalm 99, Praise to God for His Holiness Friday, Acts 10:1-8, Peter and Cornelius Saturday, Deuteronomy 9:15-24, Rebelling against God TALK: Consider some of these ideas:

"Do to others as you would have them do to you." – Luke 6:31 Jesus continues to address a crowd of his disciples. He invites his followers to shower radical love, blessing, forgiveness, generosity, and trust even on enemies and outsiders. Living in harmony with God's intent brings the reward of overflowing blessing.
