After several very good months, giving dropped back in February to \$26,212. This is not unexpected and matches the pattern we've seen at year's end for several years now. At the end of February, we had \$34,180 in cash against \$2,547 in outstanding liabilities, for a balance of \$31,633.

We continue to make good progress on fundraising for this year's building capital projects. February income for the building capital fund was \$6,686. Expenses included \$22,600 to Roofing Specialists as the 50% down payment for the new roof, and \$1,494 to Alpha Controls. An additional \$6,055 expense for the boiler came in on the 27th, and will be included in March's payment cycle.

Designated fund income included \$187 for youth, \$185 for the kitchen, \$200 for the internship fund, and \$89 unspecified. We had kitchen expenses of \$97, and a transfer to the general fund to pay well-deserved bonuses to Brenda and Nancy. Both of them have done an exceptional job, and the financial constraints of the last several years have left us unable to reward them as much as they deserve. The council felt that our improved financial stability gave us the ability to recognize the indispensable work they do every day to help keep ELC going.
