### TREASURER'S REPORT Cont.

Thank you to everyone whose generous contributions in December allowed us to finish the year on a high note. General fund giving of \$62,160 was the highest amount on record. This outpouring of support was much needed and is much appreciated, and means a firmer financial foundation to support for our ministry in the coming year.

General fund income for 2024 was \$17,839 more than budgeted, and \$48,956 more than in 2023. Last year's expenses were \$2,890 higher than projected, meaning that the general fund ended the year up \$15,271. That number doesn't include the \$11,000 transferred from the designated fund.


Generous giving also resulted in December income of \$14,262 to the building capital fund, which will be used for roof repair, water mitigation in the basement, and A/C repair in the fellowship hall. Building expenses last month include \$2,071 to Alpha Controls, \$1,715 to Oimoen Electric, and \$1,440 to Stram Stone.

Designated fund income included \$450 for the kitchen, \$125 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors,

\$187 for youth, and \$3,996 unspecified Designated fund expenses for December included \$875 as a token of appreciation for Brian Johnson's 35 years of service, and \$88 for the kitchen.

# **Supporting Our Compassion Kids: Arianna and Simon**

Ever since we started the Benevolence Program, we've supported a pair of kids from different countries through Compassion International. This program provides them support in many aspects of their life that they wouldn't receive otherwise – everything from academic tutoring to health screening to field trips, and of course spiritual guidance.

We've been able to maintain connections with kids for several years at a time before they either move to other communities or age out of the program. Jen Mullendore, who was an advocate for starting our work with Compassion, has faithfully managed our relationship with these kids for more than a decade, exchanging letters several times through the course of a year. She'll deliver an update about Arianna and Simon at church on Feb. 9.

Let me share a little bit about these two children we support now through your contributions:



Arianna is a 7-year-old who lives in Tulancingo, Mexico, with her maternal grandparents because her parents are separated. We've been sponsoring her for four years. Arianna loves art, drawing, playing games, playing house, learning about God and snacking! Arianna is living with her maternal grandparents because her parents are separated. Several times, she has mentioned her best friend, Monse, whom she met at the Compassion International Center.

In Arianna's home on the plains of Santa Ana Hueytlalpan, home to approximately 12,000 residents, typical houses are constructed of dirt floors, brick walls and tin roofs. The primary ethnic group is Otomí and the most commonly spoken language is Spanish. She helps her family by taking care of animals, cleaning, and making beds. Her favorite school subject is art. Arianna's birthday is March 11.

**Simon** is a 12-year-old who lives in Tanzania with his mother. We have been sponsoring him for seven years now! Simon has always been active, both working and playing hard. He likes jumping rope and playing about

any sport involving a ball getting bounced, kicked, or thrown. He is now a seventh grader, and his favorite classes are math and reading. He recently talked about helping his family during the cultivation season for growing maize and cassava.

Simon lives in the rural community of Kasota, home to about 11,000 people. The primary ethnic group is Sukuma, and the common language is Swahili. Typical houses are constructed of dirt floors, mud-brick walls and tin roofs. The regional diet consists of beans, cassava, cereal, maize and millet. Simon's birthday is March 25.
