

General fund income of \$26,629 was less than our general fund expenses of \$35,828, resulting in a monthly loss of \$9,199. Expenses were larger than average because the month included one of our four annual insurance payments. At month's end we had \$23,124 in assets against \$2,058 in liabilities for a general fund balance of \$21,067. Also, the Wisconsin Department of Revenue mistakenly withdrew two payroll tax payments, and we'll get that \$855 back this month. For missions, we raised \$1,449 for the ELCA World Hunger Appeal. Benevolence for the month raised \$980 for the RIC ministry, and \$109 for Divine Savior. Other designated income included \$392 for youth, \$120 for the kitchen, \$25 in memorials for Dawn Kellesvig, \$25 for landscaping, and \$93 unspecified. Designated fund expenses included \$163 for praise worship and \$6 for RIC.

Volunteers fuel Madison Area Jail Ministry's work

Sometimes, when reading about a particular noble cause, a question pops into my mind: Yeah, but who does the actual work?

Every charity organization needs money to operate. But at the end of the day, you need people on the ground who are committed to the mission and to making the 1:1 connections that effect true change.

That's especially true when it's a cause that might involve crossing a stigmatic barrier, like the Madison Area Jail Ministry. We're wired to fear jails and other detention centers, so venturing behind bars to lend a hand is different than showing up to cook at a pancake breakfast or clean up trash on a roadside.

But MAJM has been breaking through that barrier, more so in recent years than ever before. They've expanded their ministry to now feature four chaplains – Todd, whom you've heard from in these updates in the past, as well as Joyce, Laura and Kristin. And they have an army of volunteer tutors

offering personal instruction to people who are eager to learn the skills that can help them get their lives back on track.

MAJM has featured a steady flow of volunteer profiles on its Facebook page over the past several months, and their insights are both enlightening and inspiring. Here are a couple examples:

"Throughout my teaching career I enjoyed working with willing learners in a one-on-one setting," says Bob Koepp, a retired college English professor. "Working with incarcerated individuals adds another dimension, since the learners in jail are so often in particular need of hope, encouragement and contact with someone who cares about them."

"The Lord has pressed upon me the desire for His daughters to know that they are seen, loved and cared for, no matter what choices they have made or what circumstances they have encountered," says Chaplain Kristin, who volunteers on Wednesday mornings. "Not only do I get to share love and encouragement, but WOW do they fill me up! The prayers and passion from these women will knock your socks off."

There are many ways to support MAJM, which is the June mission for Benevolence. Here's what you can do:

Tutor: Are you passionate about a particular school subject and interested in educating someone interested in helping someone learn so they can better themselves? If so, you can provide one-on-one tutoring for the men and women in the Dane County Jail. To learn more about the program, email info@madisonjailministry.org.

Mentor: Research shows that community support during the first 6 months after individuals are released from jail or prison is critical to their success. You could start a New Beginnings Team, a group of volunteers who provide emotional and spiritual support to formerly incarcerated individuals during weekly meetings.

Connect: To learn more about MAJM, visit their website (madisonjailministry.org) and sign up for their newsletter, and "like" their Facebook page.

Pray: Support this "ministry of presence" by praying for the Chaplains, the men and women who are incarcerated, and the men and women responsible for their safety.

Horeb for the purpose of consideration and action on a proposal to upgrade the boiler system for heating and making repairs to the electrical systems In the church building. This proposal will include plans for financing this work.

SYNOD ASSEMBLY

How Did You Celebrate Syttende Mai?

Your Synod Assembly voting members spent the weekend at the annual meeting in Madison. The Assembly opened Friday evening with a chance to see and catch up with old friends and meet new ones. A buffet dinner was followed by worship and anniversary recognitions for Churches and Clergy.

Saturday the real work began, again with a worship service. A number of reports were submitted, then nominations for vacant positions (both rostered and lay) for Synod Council and a number of committees. No drama here!

A total of five resolutions were submitted in advance of the assembly. They were discussed and voted on.

#1 is a resolution to support a U.S. Constitutional amendment to limit money in politics. *Adopted.*

#2 is a request for a part-time Synod staff position for a justice coordinator. *Failed*

SYNOD ASSEMBLY Cont.

#3 is a resolution to adopt a confession of faith for our time. This required a written ballot. *Adopted*

#4 is a resolution related to Christian Nationalism. Specifically, "...that the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin and its 133 worshipping communities commit to studying the issue of Christian Nationalism and its threat to our Lutheran tradition in the coming year; and be it final that the synod council or its designees offer a resource list on the synod's website to aid congregations and members in this study..."*Initially Failed*, *but Adopted as amended*. I do not have the wording of the amendment.

#5 is a resolution to recognize a National Day of Remembrance for Indian Boarding Schools. *Adopted*

Nominees were voted on and approved.

Big ticket item: **Proposed spending plan February 1**, 2025 - January 31, 2027. Two iterations were proposed: one added \$50,000, one eliminated \$50,000. The eliminated one was adopted.

A long day with important actions.


