Pastor's Reflections...

What is "thanksgiving"? According to one of my favorite resources, <u>Crazy Talk: The Not-So-Stuffy Dictionary of Theological Terms</u>, it is "any prayer or action that admits you didn't do it all yourself and, yes, you did need a little help along the way" (p. 170). What about "offering"? It is "that which doesn't really belong to us in the first place and which, often only after much anguished deliberation and wringing of hands, we reluctantly part with as a "gift" to God—presumably in thanks for God's having given it to us in the first place" (p. 120).

The truth is, we easily fall into the trap of thinking that all we have—ourselves, time, food, possessions, house, family, etc.—is ours, that it belongs to us. But really, it is ALL a gift from God. Our offerings to God are about being thankful... and having our hearts in the right place. You see, God's command to tithe (from the Old Testament)—to give 10% back to God—is really for our sake, not God's! It keeps us from becoming selfish and self-centered, from letting what we have become our "god." It encourages us to rely more on our faithful, generous God. And the miracle of giving generously is that we always receive more in return.

Think of it this way: "thanksgiving" and "offering" go hand-in-hand. God, in love, gives generously to us. God has been and continues to be faithful to us. And that's what makes it possible for us to give generously—to God... to our family and friends... to our neighbors and all who are in need. Giving thanks isn't something we should save for a certain time of year. And giving thanks is more than the prayers we say before a meal. Our whole lives are an offering of thanksgiving. As Paul writes in his letter to the Thessalonians: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-17).

I believe that a person's financial giving (along with the sharing of time and talents) is a reflection of his/her faith... that our faith influences how we make use of ALL that God has given and entrusted to us.

- What does your wallet or bank statement say about God's place in your life?
- Have you grown in your level of giving as you've grown in your relationship with God?

PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS Cont.

As you know, it is budget-planning time at ELC—a "necessary evil"? or an opportunity to envision ministry possibilities for the coming year? Ministry areas and individual committees are looking back at how and where the moneys allocated were utilized in 2025, as well as looking ahead to the ministry needs and goals for the coming year. Right now, your council is "crunching the numbers" in order to put forward a budget for 2026. [Personally, I prefer the terminology of "mission plan" to "budget" because it reminds us that we are about something beyond ourselves—the missio Dei = the mission of God in this world.]

- Where does faith come into this picture? into our giving commitments?
- Does our "budget" put limits on God's plan for our ministry together?

Does ELC have the resources, financial and otherwise, to do what God is calling you to do? Yes, I believe that God has, indeed, provided you with the resources you need to carry out the ministry God calls you to as a congregation. Just as your individual giving is a reflection of your faith, so your congregational budget / mission plan is an expression of your communal faith. It is a statement about how you view God's future and your part in it. It is a list of your ministry commitments... your mission-oriented vision for the coming year.

Please hold your church leadership in prayer as they carefully discern and prepare next year's mission plan. Please prayerfully consider, as well, how <u>you</u> can participate in the work of this congregation and grow in your financial support of your ministry together. THANK YOU for your continued support of ELC... for all that you give and share for the sake of our ministry together.

General fund income in August was \$20,815, our lowest monthly total in three years. Expenses were much lower as well without a pastor, resulting in a general fund gain of \$2,813. At month's end we had \$12,844 in assets against \$2,912 in liabilities for a general fund balance of \$9,933. General fund giving for the year remains well below budget, \$44,181 less than at this point in 2024. Expenses are \$12,277 under budget, primarily due to the pastoral vacancy.

We have paid a first installment of \$88,739 to 1901 Inc. for their work on our electrical and boiler systems. \$37,767 of this amount came from closing out Rose Klir's estate fund, \$19,886 from donations to the mortgage fund, and the remaining \$31,806 was drawn from the mortgage line of credit with Farmers Savings Bank.

Benevolence for August raised \$742 for the Habitat for Humanity, and \$82 for Divine Savior. Other designated income included \$8,782 for the mortgage, \$600 for the kitchen, \$187 for youth, \$25 each for the altar guild and landscaping, \$15 for camperships, and \$102 unspecified. Designated fund expenses included \$88,739 for the electrical and boiler repairs, \$337 for youth, \$100 for technology, \$70 for camperships, \$66 for the kitchen and \$1,053 for a quilters' outing to Fireside, for which the church is being reimbursed.

The custodian is responsible for the appearance and cleanliness of the church building as well as light maintenance. This position calls for the ability to perform physical tasks such as bending, stooping, kneeling, lifting and climbing ladders. Duties include but are not limited to general cleaning, sweeping, mopping, vacuuming floors, emptying trash, and arranging tables and chairs in the fellowship hall to support church and community activities as needed. Maintenance requirements include changing light bulbs and furnace filters. The custodian will also monitor church systems such as the heating, cooling and electrical systems and report problems to the church office staff. Interested applicants should contact the church office to get a job application form.


