

Pastor's Reflections...

As we enter the month of December, we also enter a new Church year—and the season of **ADVENT**. The 4 weeks of **ADVENT** are among the busiest, most hectic weeks of the year—filled with baking, shopping, decorating, get-togethers and holiday parties, and a multitude of other activities that demand our time and attention. With all the busy-ness of the season, it's easy to forget what's really at the end of the **ADVENT** journey—the birth of Jesus, the Savior of the world.

But you know what? The weeks leading up to that first Christmas were filled with preparations and hectic busy-ness too! Mary and Joseph and their family, friends, and neighbors had to pack and prepare for their long foot-journeys to their home towns to be counted in a census. And remember, they had to carry all they needed: food, clothing, etc. Can you imagine Mary's and Joseph's stress level given the fact that Mary was 8+ months pregnant and preparing to give birth for the first time?!?

The word **ADVENT** means "to come" or "to arrive." Whose coming or arrival are we <u>waiting for... preparing for...</u> and <u>hoping for</u> during this season? The "coming of God" in Christ Jesus, the One called Emmanuel—which means "God with us" (Matthew 1:23).

This "coming of God" is not just remembering Jesus' birth in Bethlehem some 2000+ years ago. It is also looking for and experiencing the "coming of God" here and now—often where and when we least expect to see God. And it is anticipating the "coming of God" in our Lord's future coming again, too.

In the midst of the busy-ness of this season, **ADVENT** invites us <u>to pause</u>... <u>to make room</u> in our lives for the One for whom there was not room in the inn... <u>to pray</u> for God to come and disrupt our busy lives!

I know it's easy to want to rush past **ADVENT** to get to the celebration of *Christmas*, but I invite you to let these weeks of **ADVENT** be for you what they are intended to be: a time of <u>waiting</u>... <u>preparing</u>... and <u>hoping</u> for the "coming of God." It is a time for us to live in the hope and joy of this promise: "She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus [which means "God saves"] for he will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21). For through Jesus, God's grace and mercy fall upon us... forgiveness washes over us... and new life grows within us. Through Jesus, we come to know and experience Emmanuel – "God with us."

ADVENT blessings to you and yours! And a very *Merry Christmas*!

TREASURER'S REPORT Cont.

General fund income in October was \$18,741, our lowest amount since at least 2019, which is as far back as my records go. Expenses were \$30,586, resulting in a general fund loss of \$12,926. At month's end we had \$6,240 in assets against \$4,083 in liabilities for a general fund balance of \$2,157. Expenses continue to track closely with our budgeted estimates, setting aside the temporarily lower personnel expenses due to the pastoral vacancy over the summer. But giving remains well under projections, and current operations will not be sustainable over the medium term if that trend continues. Giving trends will play a large role in determining the compensation package we'll be able to offer to a prospective senior pastor.

Remember that we now also have mortgage expenses not included in the general fund. The boiler and roofing repairs have been completed, and our final mortgage balance is \$115,426. We'll be responsible for paying this mortgage down over a 20-year amortization (but hopefully much faster!), paying 6.99% on the outstanding balance. Turning to our other funds, we received \$927 for the building fund, and spent \$1,150 on electric repairs to the choir room lights. Benevolence for October raised \$700 for Lutheran Campus Ministry, and \$78 for Divine Savior. Other designated income included \$587 for the mortgage, \$300 for music, \$187 for youth, \$90 for RIC, \$50 for the altar guild, \$25 for Neighbors Helping Neighbors, and \$69 unspecified. Designated fund expenses included \$64,000 for roof repairs, \$2,605 for benevolence, \$296 in mortgage interest, and \$131 for music.

BENEVOLENCE

An investment in Cecilia and other YAGM leaders

A tenet of the Benevolence Program is to feature ministries that create local, regional, and global impact. Our support of the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) beautifully accomplishes all three.

Each year, YAGM sends more than 85 mission-oriented volunteers (ages 21–35) to 10 countries, including Argentina/Uruguay, Australia, Central Europe, Jerusalem and the West Bank, Madagascar, Mexico, Rwanda, Senegal, the United Kingdom. More than 800 alumni have completed this program, many of whom now serve in significant leadership roles across the church and throughout society.

ELC of Mount Horeb has a personal connection to this ministry through Cecilia Hook, who shared her YAGM experience in Senegal with us last year. As we prepare to feature YAGM as our December mission, we invited Cecilia to reflect on the lasting impact of her service. Here is her message:

As I have been trying to write my reflections on Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) now, I struggle. I struggle because words can only do so much ... if only I could pour my heart onto the page. I have been having a hard time writing about my experience since just before I left Senegal and now it is almost a year-and-a-half later. It is hard to condense such an impactful experience into something that others can fully understand. The fact is, I am still learning from, and coming to understand, my own experience. The impact does not end the day you arrive back in your sending community. I would argue it has just begun.

Young Adults in Global Mission is a program that gives Young Adults the chance to learn about the world beyond themselves – and at the same time provides the opportunity to share themselves with their host community in ways they may never have imagined. Each young adult will have their own experience and takeaways. Still, many of us have common experiences. As I see it, a year doing YAGM is a time to get to know others, learn about community, share culture, look inward at one's self, and find a deeper connection to the world and its people.

For me, living and working in Senegal showed me a new side to love, community, and what it means to find home. Working through daily language and cultural barriers reminded me how reliant we are on each other. The Senegalese values of deep hospitality and community had a long-lasting impact on me. When I think of Senegal, I think of

greetings – and how in these greetings, I learned to take time for others everywhere I went. I reflect on how I was enveloped and welcomed into my host family – and beyond that, the community at large.

As I move through my life at home, I now and forever will sit with this as I consider those once foreign or on the outside of my own communities, how can I welcome as I have been welcomed. This is certainly not the only take away I have from my time in Senegal but it is one that sits heavy with me every day.

Let me close with a verse (Matthew 25:35) that continues to inspire me and speaks to YAGM's mission: "I was a stranger and you invited me in."

Support for YAGM isn't simply a donation — it's an investment. It strengthens the next generation of leaders shaped by global service, and it amplifies the reach and impact of our church around the world.

On average, it costs about \$15,000 to equip one young adult for a year of service, including training, airfare, a modest living allowance, health insurance, and simple room and board. That's roughly \$40 a day to empower young leaders through life-changing, cross-cultural ministry. As a congregation, let's see how many of those "days" we can help provide for next year's YAGM cohort.

And perhaps there's a young adult in your life who might be a great fit for this program? Applications are accepted year-round; those who apply by Feb. 1 will be considered for the service year beginning in August, with priority given to applications received before Jan. 15.



Mount Horeb Community Blood Drive

An Interview with Linda Schroeder

Reporter: I'm here with Linda Schroeder, a member of ELC in Mt Horeb.

Good morning, Linda! I've done some research and found out you're a very active member of ELC! And I've been told there's a very important event that you've taken charge of. Can you tell me what that is?

Linda: It's the Red Cross Blood Drive that is held here at ELC five time a year.

Reporter: That's wonderful! How did you get involved?

Linda: I was in a horrible accident and received life-saving blood from the Red Cross. Through that experience I met a representative, Diane Nichols, the blood drive coordinator from the Red Cross. Once I recovered, she encouraged me to stay involved. I thought working at our blood drives would be good for me.

Reporter: I imagine that's a big responsibility. You must have a dedicated team helping you.

Linda: Only a great group of volunteers. Some are the same for each event, others are coming in to help out when they're available. I also do "recruiting", advocating for donating and helping at the scheduled drives.

Reporter: I've been in the building at times when there is a drive-in progress. I see folks at the registration/welcome table. And more in the kitchen managing the refreshments for the donors. Are these volunteers too?

Linda: Yes, all volunteers!

Reporter: Who supplies the refreshments? Are they all purchased? I'm also aware that you serve the most awesome egg salad sandwiches. Is this a volunteer activity also?

Linda: Yes! Mary Meister donates the ingredients and makes and delivers the egg salad the day of the drive. Volunteers make the sandwiches and keep the donors supplied while they're recovering. The Red Cross supplies beverages, and other folks drop off "goodies" such as cookies and bars.

Reporter: Linda, you're certainly a gem! The effort it takes to help the blood donors cannot be measured! What a perfect way to pay forward the life-saving blood donations you received after your accident. Be proud of this work you are doing! Other volunteers are always welcome, especially those who take time to give the gift of life! Sincere thanks to you and all the volunteers!

Ann, Chris, Dianne and Kate will meet to create a new Opportunities for Service description so existing and new members can use their gifts and strengths and volunteer or join a group they feel they can contribute to.

Johnnie Denton has volunteered to be a representative, and Cecilia Hook has volunteered to be a youth representative for the Synod Assembly (gathering date still being determined). THANK YOU both!

A mixed air thermostat will aid in protecting the coil from freezing and limit mixed temperature to no lower than 60 degrees. This work will be coordinated with Karl Lasse, ELC Maintenance Manager. THANK YOU to Diane Bartz for staying on top of these repairs and getting approval for work to be done.

MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES

Dates: October 20 (start date) to Nov 10th - 2025

This is a quick note to let you know what I have been doing over my first few weeks.

The first week I spent a good deal of time getting acquainted with people and had an overview of the electrical system and spent time learning how to start the boilers and air handlers in the building. Our first heating issue arose with CO2 alarms in the boiler room and spent time with Andy troubleshooting that issue.

The second week I worked with Alpha systems and 1901 electrical after additional boiler issues were found. Minor maintenance was performed on floor drains, lighting in the EXIT signs, the boiler room door, and I fixed a light fixture in the stairway between sanctuary and the chapel.

Finally, last week Jeremy and I worked on getting covers on the light fixtures in the music room, added a soap dispenser in the men's bathroom, fixed downspout, and dumpster not locking. I also worked on a noisy TRANE heater in the entry way near main street. In addition to those activities I spent time with our Mount Horeb Fire Department on a safety inspection with Kimberly Sailor on Nov 6th. Kimberly from MHFD was very pleased that most safety issues from Sept 9 were resolved and I only have 2 issues to work on.
